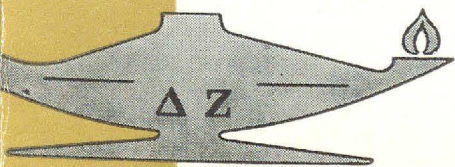

The college sorority has provided a training ground for the development of those leadership qualities. Officer training, pledge training, standards programs, social functions, philanthropic projects—these and many other activities offer unlimited opportunities to develop organizational abilities. But training in organizational techniques alone is not enough. A college degree and high grades do not of themselves guarantee the acquisition of these mental abilities. Learning is an active process, not an exercise in memorization and examination book “play back.” To learn one must be inquisitive, and to think one must practice.

We must encourage our collegiates to exploit every intellectual and cultural opportunity offered by the college and community—to attend lectures and university meetings, to participate in seminars and cultural festivals, to make wider use of research materials and library facilities—to listen, to read, to question. For only by actively participating in a variety of intellectual experiences will they have the opportunities to develop the ability to think! We should encourage our chapters to bring these intellectual experiences into their own chapter houses and gatherings. A sorority should provide an exhilarating atmosphere of lively discussion and stimulating conversation.

We must help our chapters to secure the tools they require, we must give them the encouragement they need, and we must supply the guidance they desire. We are most privileged to be working with young women who will soon take their place in community activities; they will represent to others the service of sorority women.

It is our responsibility to these collegiates to help them develop into responsible leaders. It is our responsibility to communities to send to them well-trained, dedicated women who can THINK!

# An Adventure in Friendship

## Why a Nursery School for the Deaf? . . .

. . . the question has been answered as far as members of the Milwaukee, Wis., alumnae chapter of Delta Zeta are concerned.

They see the answer in the faces of the children who attended just such a nursery school in Milwaukee. They see the alertness with which these silent youngsters fix their eyes on their teacher, hoping to see sounds she makes. They see the sociability which the children have developed through learning to do things together.

Don't ask the Milwaukee alumnae *why* . . . they know.

The Nursery School and Delta Zeta's connection with it all began in June of 1962 at the sorority's national convention in Hot Springs, Ark. At that time it was decided that every year \$2500 would be presented to the American Hearing Society as part of Delta Zeta's support of its Hard of Hearing philanthropy.

As each check is received, the executive director of the Society turns it over to one of its member organizations in this country. Then, in turn, the Delta Zeta alumnae chapter in that area adopts the local hearing society as its philanthropy and supports it financially and through

services in the expansion of any project resulting from that \$2500.

That first check went to Mr. Crayton Walker, executive director, who presented it to Miss June Carr, executive director of the Milwaukee Hearing Society. And on Feb. 4, 1962 a much needed nursery school for deaf children was begun by Miss Carr in Milwaukee, using this money as a starter.

Seven children, aged 2½ to 3 years of age, were selected for the original program with Harriet Hoppert as their teacher. The classes were and still are held three mornings each week at the Hearing Society headquarters. Those original seven children completed the program in August, 1963, and by that time were ready to enter regular deaf classes set up in Milwaukee schools.

Another group of youngsters began the second program in the Fall of 1963 under a new teacher, Jappie Bryant King (Mrs. Cecil).

The program has long since proven its worth. In the words of Miss Carr, "The deaf child should have an opportunity to play experience with other children. First hand experience gives the deaf child a basis for what he learns in lip-reading.

"In a group situation," she says, "social growth is given an impetus. Each child helps the others to adjust—a process they must continue all their lives. Children learn from others many things we as adults cannot teach them."

The aims of the nursery school according to Miss Hoppert are: 1) to provide a social climate so that children will feel a need to communicate with each other orally, 2) to help the children to develop through free but supervised play, good social habits, such as sharing and taking turns, 3) to develop the child's unimpaired senses by giving them many varied experiences involving these senses, and 4) to provide opportunities for the children to do as much for themselves as they can, thus building a feeling of independence.

And where does the local chapter of Delta Zeta fit into all this? When the nursery was organized the alumnae organized a Milwaukee Society Hearing Committee with which to offer financial and volunteer service both in the nursery program and in existing hearing society services.

Betty Jane Lamb and Mrs. William Moller are

co-chairmen of the committee. Mrs. Moller is former province director of Wisconsin and is a member of the board of directors of the Society.

The alumnae offer volunteer service in the form of drivers to transport the children to school when parents are unable to do so. They also assist when social activities require.

All Delta Zetas participate in making materials for the youngsters to use in class . . . mounting pictures, collecting noisemakers, collecting play-house equipment and making learning materials. Even DZ husbands assist by cutting out wooden models of animals, people and toys which their wives paint.

Epsilon Chi chapter at University of Wisconsin in Milwaukee has also adopted the society as its philanthropy and from here on in will assist financially and with services. The Waukesha alumnae group has recently joined in to help also.

There is no help too small or too large for the DZs to render. All milk and crackers, the snacks for the children, are provided by the DZ committee as are clothes for the dolls used in class work.

It is only fitting that we name the other mem-



bers of a committee which works long and hard to keep the nursery going. They are Mrs. Paul Monfils, volunteers; Mrs. Herbert Preston, materials and equipment; Mrs. James Chapel, public relations and publicity; Mrs. Warren Ritter, materials and equipment, and Mrs. Harold Sinn, ways and means.

The Milwaukee Hearing Society is a Red Feather agency with a budget of \$20,000 annually. It is hoped that this amount can be raised substantially in the near future so the nursery

school can be wholly supported by it. Whether or not the money will be forthcoming is still in question. But no matter the outcome, the Delta Zetas in Milwaukee have vowed their continued support and, if need be, will undertake projects to keep it going.

These hardworking alumnæ feel a satisfaction and sense of accomplishment difficult to explain. Their *adventure in friendship* has made the words Delta Zeta mean something special to all of us.

## Meet Our Woman of The Year

HELEN NEAL RADKE, noted educator and president of the National School Board Association for the year 1963-64, has been named Delta Zeta Woman of the Year for 1964 by a committee of national judges. Mrs. Radke became a member of Delta Zeta at the University of Washington, Seattle, Washington.

Tangible evidence of this award, a specially designed medallion was presented at a Founder's Day celebration as announcement of the winner was made simultaneously throughout the nation to Delta Zeta's 153 college chapters and 232 alumnae chapters.

Helen Neal Radke, mother of three, a daughter and two boys, lives with her husband Fred in Port Angeles, Washington where she is president of the local school board. She has been a member of that board since 1948 and is also a past president of the Washington State School Directors Association. Mrs. Radke has also been a member of the Washington State Board of Education and the State Board for Vocational Education since 1955.

On the national level, Mrs. Radke has been an NSBA director since 1957, serving as second vice-president in 1961-62 and as first vice president in 1962-63 before being elected to the presi-

dency for the year 1963-64. She is the second woman to be elected to this office in the 24-year history of the board. One of the many services she has given while serving as an NSBA board member is that of chief author of NSBA's Reference Manual on Written School Board Policies which is provided to school boards throughout the country.

A delegate to the White House Conference on Education, Mrs. Radke later served as delegate to the White House Conference on Children and Youth. More recently she served as a member of President Kennedy's Panel of Consultants on Vocational Education and is a member of the Governor's committee on Employment and Youth in her state.

Mrs. Radke has visited hundreds of schools throughout the United States and has toured schools in Europe and Russia.

Delta Zeta's Woman of the Year is not unaccustomed to honors as she is a member of Phi Beta Kappa and Pi Sigma Lambda honoraries and has been honored as woman of the year by the Washington State Federation of Business and Professional Women.

# Advice to Service Wives Is . . . Go With Him!

DREAD SITTING at home while your service man husband serves his tour of duty in a "hard-ship" area? Go with him!

Sally Rosenheimer Sanders (Mrs. Peter), Northwestern, Alpha Alpha, 1957, and I (Esther Demas Johnson, Alpha Delta, George Washington University, 1950, wife of Lt. Col. Lawrence Johnson, Jr.) did just that and met each other for the first time in Korea. We taught at the same mission college in Taegu, Camp Henry.

The experience was unique. Our housing was strictly Korean—three or four rooms, sliding rice-paper doors, oriental style bath and kitchen (no plumbing), just running cold water. Sally and Peter lived in the housing area provided for its teachers by Keimyung Christian College, a Korean college under the general supervision of the United Presbyterian Mission. Larry, my husband, and I lived in a similar house a short walk from the post. The houses were enclosed behind the high stone walls—a protective measure necessary in Korea for centuries.

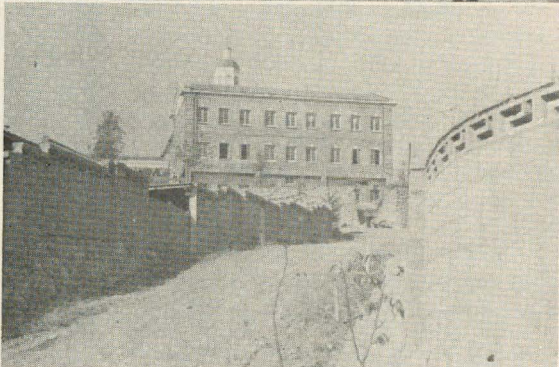
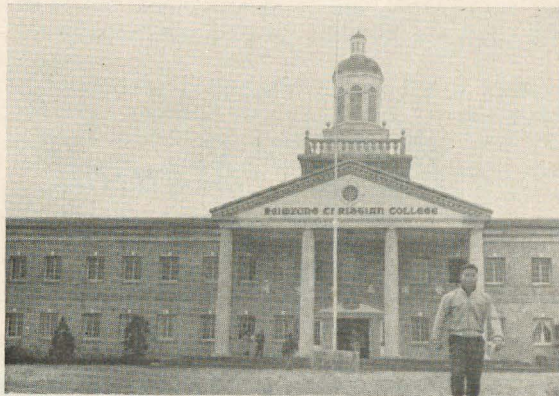
Keimyung College is on a hill not far from the city. Still in its growing years, it is spending money on landscaping and new buildings and saving on things like lights and heat. Schools in Taegu close during December, January, and February when the days are short and cold. They make up for this enforced Winter vacation by continuing during the Summer—with a two-week break in late August.

With cholera, typhoid fever, and amoebic dysentery rampant in Summer months, we limited our food shopping to U.S. sources. All the post conveniences and facilities were available to us although housing was not. Water had to be treated with chlorine or boiled. Interestingly enough, when reservoirs are full after a rainy season, water is turned on only three hours a day. We stored our drinking water in a ten-gallon pottery jar, normally used by Koreans for Winter food storage. Bath and laundry water were collected daily in a big round Japanese tub.

Although our houses were built with Korean "ondol" floors (a kind of radiant heat using powdered anthracite coal briquets), we used electric and kerosene heaters exclusively. The

hot-floor heating system, even when functioning properly is a potentially dangerous source of carbon monoxide. Numerous Korean deaths occur each Winter because of damaged or improperly constructed "ondol" floors.

This life, for a year, puts you very close to another world in another century. The horse

collar is not yet known. Agricultural machinery is unheard of. Night soil is the only fertilizer, a fact abundantly clear to the senses. Babies are strapped to mothers' backs till they can walk. Lepers are all too prevalent. Thievery as a source of income is common. The markets, great spreading jungles of life, sell everything from dog meat to exquisite brass and lacquerware.

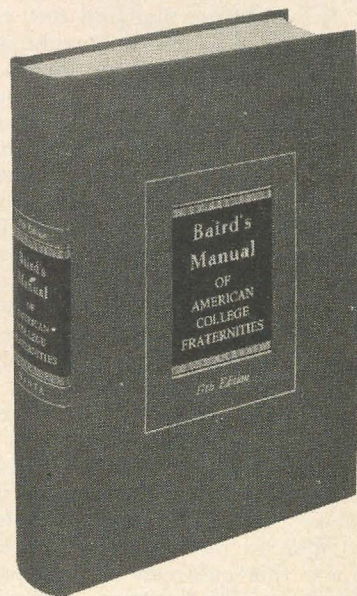
But you will meet and make friends with people

called the "Irish of the Orient." You will have a rare opportunity to serve your country all on your own if you become an "individually-sponsored" wife. And it goes without saying you will please your husband and make his hardship tour a happier one.

## *Baird's Manual* on ALA List of Best References



*Baird's Manual of American College Fraternities*, 17th Edition, which tells the whole story of the nation's fraternities and sororities, has been selected as one of the outstanding reference books published last year.

The selection was made by the American Library Association through its Reference Services Division, and the book was included in the exhibit at the Annual Conference of the American Library Association held at St. Louis during the Summer.

An annotated list of the books appeared in the Special Reference Issue of the *Library Journal* in an article, Reference Books of 1963."

The 17th Edition of the "bible of the Greek-letter world" started by William Raimond Baird of Beta Theta Pi in 1879, provides factual an-

swers to those who ask, "Have the fraternities stopped growing?" They most decidedly have not stopped growing. As college enrollments have expanded, the fraternities and sororities have also grown and many new institutions have welcomed them.

The recent edition, edited by John Robson of Sigma Phi Epsilon, contains an enlarged introduction which in describing the nature of the college fraternity shows why it is an important institution which has contributed significantly to America as a civilization.

## *Creates With Watercolors*

LOGGING OPERATIONS in northern California, boats at the mouth of the Columbia River, the lighthouse at Westport, Wash., these are the things Esther Hurtt Hodge (Mrs. Melville) picks for her subject matter when she paints.

Mrs. Hodge resides in Rock Island, Ill., and her home there abounds with her watercolors. An art teacher for 16 years at Moline's Calvin Coolidge Jr. High School, she was an art education major at University of North Dakota from where she was graduated and where she joined Upsilon chapter. Since then she has taken courses at Augustana and Marycrest Colleges.

Actually, she didn't begin to paint seriously until about 8 years ago. She was always too busy teaching her students. But finally "watching my students at work, I thought it looked like fun!" she says.

Since Mr. Hodge's retirement in 1956 the Hodges have spent most of their Summers on the West coast where their son and daughter reside and it is there Mrs. Hodge finds many of her subjects. Two trips to the East coast as well as to her hometown of Hoople, N.D., have also found their way into her memory via her watercolors.

Sometimes Esther Hodge begins a painting outdoors and finishes it at home. Or she makes a rapid sketch and does the painting later. She uses photos as an aid too, doing a painting over several times if she's not satisfied with it. Occasionally she makes another copy of a painting, if someone requests it.

In June, 1963, Mrs. Hodge retired from the teaching she enjoyed so much and now she has the time to really delve feet first into her art.

She hopes to try oil painting and she also wants to find more time for sewing, gardening and reading.

Her many awards include an honorable mention in 1962 in the Professional Division at the Montlake Terrace Art Festival in Seattle and in 1960 the Borden Co. award in watercolor at the Quad-City Exhibition in the Davenport, Iowa, Municipal Art Gallery.

Mrs. Hodge finds pleasure not only in doing paintings of places she's visited and enjoyed but also in having them as a permanent memory. "It brings it all home again," she says. "It's like being there again."

# Texas DZ Goes Hollywood

**DALLAS** Delta Zeta alumna, Joan Tompkins Hallmark, was the only local actress to be given a leading role in the movie "Indian Paint," which was filmed the Summer of 1963 on location near Mansfield and Grand Prairie, Texas.

Joan had the only featured woman's role in the movie, playing Amatula, wife of Arikara Indian chief Hevatanu, and mother of Nishko. The part of Nishko, central character of the movie, was played by well-known television star Johnny Crawford of "The Rifleman" series.

A great part of the movie's plot revolves around Nishko and his experiences in winning the loyalty and affection of a pony. Others involved in the production included Jay Silverheels, as the chief—a real Indian remembered for his famous role as Tonto, the Lone Ranger's indispensable sidekick, and Norman Foster who directed the proceedings.

According to Joan, being a movie star is not all glamour and luxury; it can be hard, gruelling work. Her work day started around 5:30 A.M. with her drive to Grand Prairie, and she usually was not home until 7:30 at night, when she still had homemaking duties to perform for her husband and two sons, age 7 and 3.

Once on the set, she had to be made up to look like an Indian (even Jay Silverheels had to have some Indian makeup) because the film was shot in technicolor and in cinemascope, requiring every detail to be correct. As the cameras started rolling, the lights were turned on—high voltage—and the Texas mid-summer sun did its part to bring the temperature up to and over 100°. All the heat made everyone's greasy Indian make-up melt and streak, necessitating frequent touch-ups and reapplication.

There were so many interesting facets of motion picture work that most of us would never imagine, such as a cloud drifting across the sun ruining the shot because of light change; the sound of an airplane overhead, temperamental animals, and the difficulty of making close-up shots. As Joan put it, "In close-ups, the bright lights are focused on the actor's face, and to keep him from blinking or squinting the eyes is not easy." To force yourself to keep your eyes open and to concentrate on the dialogue at the same time *was* work.

"Indian Paint" is due for release soon and certainly should be a must for Delta Zetas, if for no other reason than to see "one of our own" on the screen. Too, Joan says that it is a family-type movie, and one that children as well as adults should enjoy.

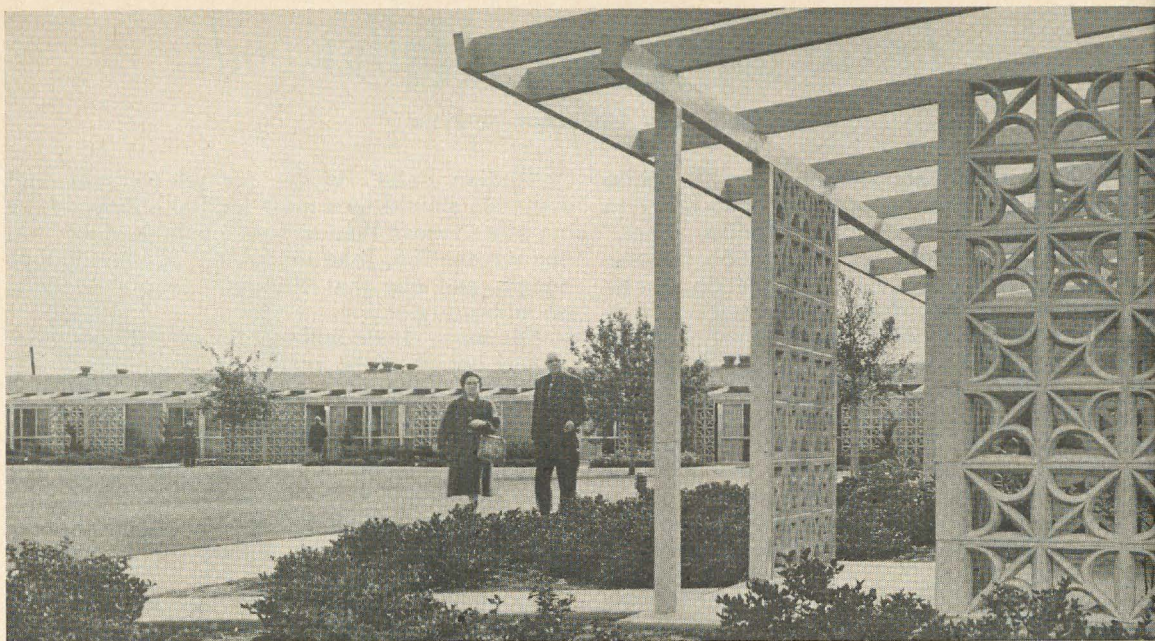
For now, Joan will continue with her television commercials, modeling, teaching, directing and performing on stage for Theater Three in Dallas, and her own studio, Richardson Academy of Drama. Indicative of her personality and admirable qualities is the fact that she will not leave her family to go on location any distance for an undetermined period of time. 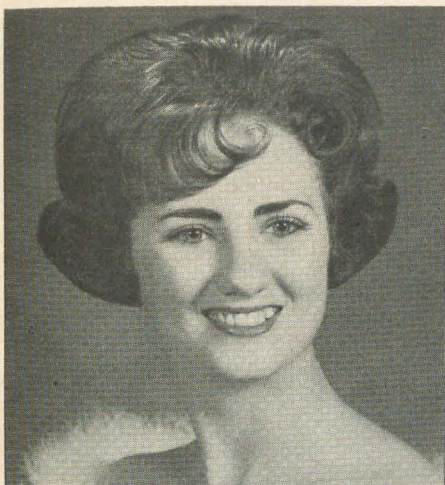

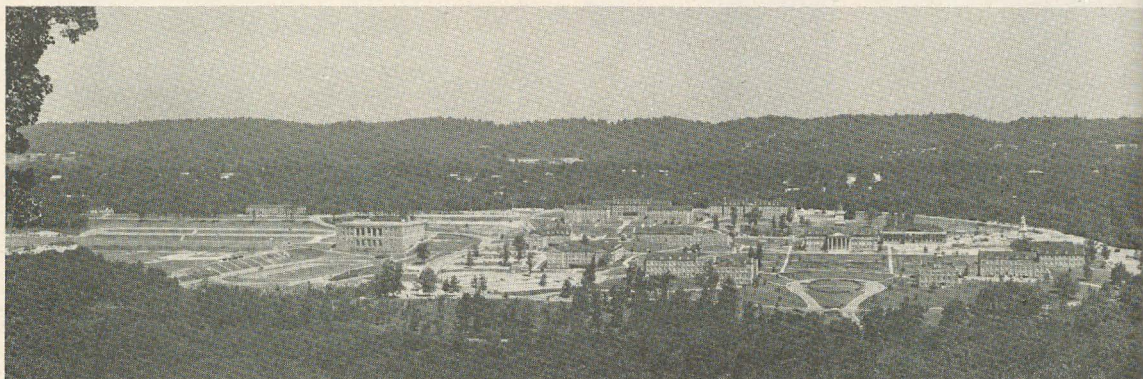

Founded in 1924 on the Howard University campus, Alpha Pi chapter is the home of DZ's 1963 Woman of the Year, Gail Patrick Jackson, producer of the "Perry Mason Show."

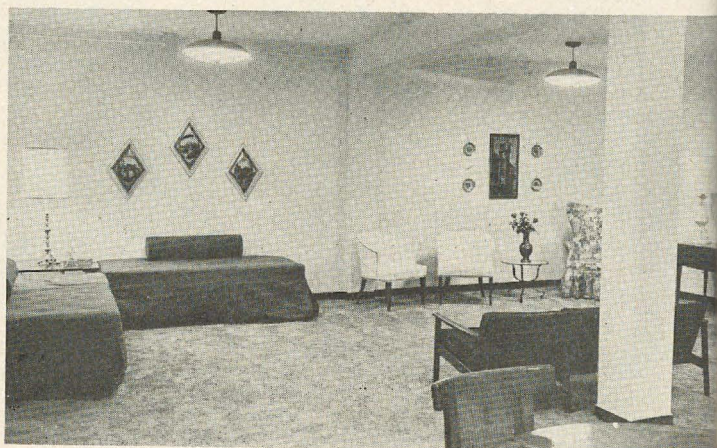
During the 23 years on the old campus, the chapter occupied a sorority house but since moving to the new campus in 1957, the chapter along with other sororities has occupied chapter rooms in the largest girls' dormitory.

The room has recently been re-decorated and a new piano purchase is planned. The chapter is active in all campus activity and the moneymaking DZ Mr. Talent contest has become a highlight of Greek Week.

The college itself is an agency of the Alabama Baptist State Convention and is privately supported. Founded in 1842 by a group of Baptist ministers and planters in

Marion, Ala., the college survived two destructive fires, the Civil War and Reconstruction.

The college was moved to Birmingham in 1888 to East Lake campus. In 1957 the move to the new campus took place. Its 400 acre campus features Georgian and Colonial architecture. Located in the mountainous area of Shades Valley the campus is less than six miles from Birmingham.

# A Visit to U. of Alabama

Alpha Gamma chapter was begun in the Spring of 1921 with a group of six, led by the now Marion Bishop Moxley (Mrs. Stephen), who was a DZ pledge from Lumbard College (now Knox College). The group petitioned to begin a Delta Zeta chapter at University of Alabama.

In the Summer of 1922 the petition was granted and in the Fall of that year DZ was installed—the fifth sorority on campus. Mrs. Moxley was the first president.

The first house was built in 1926 and its most recent home was completed in 1962. The chapter is on the move upward in membership, activities and campus prestige.

Located at the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, the chapter house is just part of a 420 acre campus, picturesque with its old South atmosphere. Buildings are Colonial and Georgian in style.

The university opened in 1831. In 1865 most of the buildings were burned to the ground by a body of Federal cavalry during the Civil War. Building began anew in 1867 and classes resumed in 1869.

Another mother-daughter banquet was held by **Dayton** women, with more than 100 in attendance.

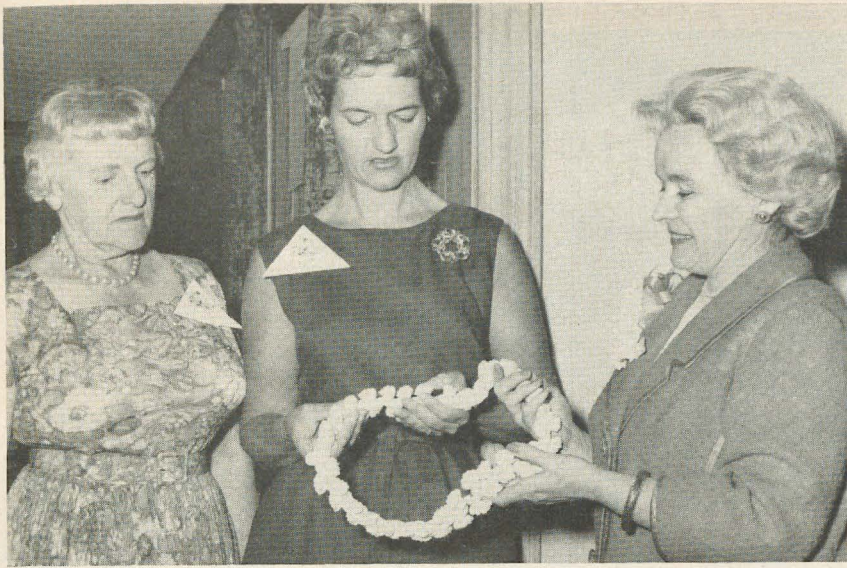

The idea of the Province Development Plan is to develop pride in membership which comes through knowledge and will be implemented through the usual visitations, workshops within the provinces and state days.

In the words of past president, Gertrude Fariss, "We develop province pride through good leaders. We are all responsible for the life and existence of DZ." And through the plan it is hoped that we can all add, through our good leaders, to the life and existence of DZ.

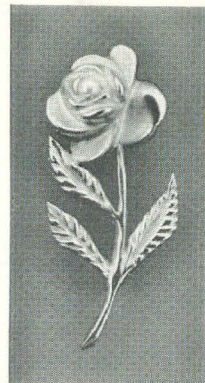
