- 1969 -

We Delta Zetas, like our astronauts, must have dedication, discipline and understanding. They knew their goal, and worked tirelessly to attain it. Our goal is a strong, meaningful, lasting Delta Zeta. It is based on friendship, person-to-person, group-to-group, and it generates a power strong enough to defy and defeat adverse forces.

We believe in the Fraternity system. We believe in Delta Zeta, in its development of the individual, its sharing of benefits and privileges, and the encouragement of open, eager minds set on goals of truth and growth. We believe in the promise of tomorrow and in our part in it through Delta Zeta.

I hereby proclaim this October twenty-fourth to be observed as Founders Day by our entire membership and request that our colors of rose and green be worn to commemorate the renewal of our pledge of faith.

Given under my hand and the seal of the sorority, this twenty-sixth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty nine, and of the founding of the sorority, the sixty seventh.

Travel is recommended during the first part of the month of **April**. If your State Day is planned for this month, it might be a good idea to attend.



UP! UP!

Northern California's State Day on April 12 was held at International House in Berkeley with the theme "Up, Up and Away." Guest speaker for the occasion was Ivy Baker Priest, AX, treasurer for the State of California. Her talk is reprinted in full so that Delta Zetas everywhere can enjoy it.

As one who felt highly honored upon being invited into the sisterhood of Delta Zeta, I find it difficult to express how proud I am to have been asked to address the State Day luncheon. You have made me very happy.

A particularly satisfying feature of Delta Zeta membership for me is the feeling that I am part of an organization so concerned with the world that surrounds us and so dedicated to helping make it a better place to be. I was pointedly reminded of our nationwide philanthropies and projects in the field of speech, hearing and sight handicaps during the trip down here today from Sacramento. Accompanying me was Kay Roberts whose mother many of you will remember as Dorothy Walker Scott who was Delta Zeta's Woman of the Year in 1952 because of her work with and among the blind. Kay's husband is Assistant State Treasurer Bruce Roberts, and knowing them as well as I do, and knowing the devotion of Kay and her mother to the principles of Delta Zeta only increases my personal feeling of reward from sharing in the work of the sorority.

My original intention for today was to share with you some of my enthusiasm for the intriguing job I hold in Sacramento—in fact, I think your programs list my topic as "Housekeeping for \$48 Billion Dollars." But as I thought more about Delta Zeta and its closely connected campus and alumnae activities, plus the "Up, Up and Away!" theme of this meeting, I decided to exercise the traditional prerogative and change my mind.

It seems to me that this is a good time and place for all of us—both those still on the campus and the alumnae—to discuss our strong mutual concern about the proper relation of today's youth to today's world.

How do we all fit in together and how do we of an older generation fulfill our obligation to those who will be our successors?

Never before in the history of man have so many young people so enthusiastically concerned themselves with the world about them. They have more spirit, more health, more wealth, more education and more of everything than any preceding generation. Their interests are broader and their aspirations are loftier.

When they sing "Up! Up! And Away!" they really mean it.

Historically, each generation of man since the Dark Ages has made greater advances and brought about greater change than its predecessors. Today's youth is part of a generation that has opened a greater gap between itself and its parent generation than any other group in history. If some of us can look back from the day of the moon shot and recall the end of the horse and buggy era, we can only speculate on what mark in human progress the youth of today can achieve.

I, for one, only wish I could go along with them to wherever it is they are heading because I know it is certain to be challenging, exciting, rewarding and full of wonders beyond our immediate view and comprehension today.

Society has the concurrently difficult and enviable task of transmitting to youth the progress and research findings that will make their horizons truly unlimited—so that they need not consider that the moon or any other known planet or member of our solar system is necessarily a stopping place. Because of what has already been achieved, they can honestly ask the question, "What is the universe?" and logically expect to find an answer in their lifetime.

Theirs will be the challenge and opportunity to fully develop nuclear energy to its total benefit to mankind. For example, it can be foreseen that under the pressure of population growth and the impetus of research, this source of energy could resolve the water distribution problems that cause a huge portion of this nation from Colorado to the west slope of the Sierras to be known as the Great American Desert. That vast territory represents a whole new frontier right here in this country in which their generation will have its chance to develop cities, industries, parks and homes and families—where they can use their own ideas, where they will be able to find out for themselves if they can do a better job of it.

AND AWAY!

From the progress that has been made in conquering polio and other fearful diseases, they will be able to go on toward the goal of releasing man forever from the threat of disease and accomplish such medical wonders as have been predicted for the year 2000—only 31 years away—that will make possible an *Average* life expectancy of over 100 years! Medical science and public health advances will be such that the centenarian of the year 2000 will be just as spry, as full of zip and zest for living as a healthy person of 70 is today. With heart transplants already relatively old stuff, their rocket-propelled generation enters whole new concepts of physical well-being for all mankind.

And speaking of rocket propulsion, we all expect the United States to put a man on the moon this year. Right now it is a safe bet that some of today's youth may get a chance to visit one of the lavish excursion hotels on the moon foreseen by Dr. Wernher Von Braun, the internationally famed rocketry and missile authority. In 1957, just 12 years ago, Dr. Von Braun predicted that before 2057, voyages to the moon will have become commonplace and that earth people will vacation there at luxury establishments complete with great windows for enjoying the magnificent scenery. Events of the past 12 years indicate he was conservative in his estimates, but his speculation opens a veritable galaxy of new frontiers for this new generation.

The noted psychologist, Dr. John Weir, has predicted that man can look forward to learning more about himself in the next 100 years than he has in the preceding one million. He could discover the causes and cures of sickness and pain, or hate and destruction. He could learn to circumvent many of his limitations. He could learn how to change himself. Conceivably within the life span of today's youth, the life and social sciences could put man in control of his own destiny.

With Dr. Weir's words we arrive at the greatest and perhaps most immediate challenge and opportunity for both the old and this new generation.

Through material developments far beyond anything mankind ever conceived before, we of what is now the receding generation are, and for some time will be, handing to them—in this country at least—a degree of freedom from want that releases more and more of

their energies and talents for application to the nagging questions of mankind that seem to increase rather than decrease with economic prosperity.

Their share in this freedom from want and their ability to meet their responsibilities in resolving the inequities of human relations are directly connected to their educational preparation. They have a special responsibility to take full advantage of all that the school and community offer, and put their full self into the work of gathering factual knowledge and learning how to live in this changing world. They must be encouraged to work equally as hard at learning to live

Ivy BAKER PRIEST is California's 25th State Treasurer, the only woman in history to hold the position, as well as the first woman ever chosen by voters to serve in any of California's seven top Constitutional offices.

A native of Kimberly, Utah, Mrs. Priest has been a California resident since leaving office in Washington, D.C., after serving for eight years as Treasurer of the United States in the Eisenhower administration.

She is a trustee for the National Society for Crippled Children and Adults, director of the California Easter Seal Society, member of the International Soroptimist Club, director of the Greater Los Angeles Safety Council, member of the Business and Professional Women's Club, honorary life member of the Women's Advertising Club of Washington, D.C., and international member of Beta Sigma Phi Sorority.

She holds several honorary doctorates, including one in Humane Letters from Elmira College, Elmira, N.Y.; honorary Doctorate of Science in Business Administration from Bryant College, Providence, R.I.; and an honorary Doctor of Laws from Rider College, Trenton, N.J.

Her contributions to society have earned her several high honors, including nomination as one of the twenty most outstanding women in this century by the Women's Newspaper Editors and Publishers Association. Mrs. Priest has received an achievement award from the Women's National Press Club for outstanding accomplishment in politics, and has received a Woman of Achievement Award from the American Federation of Soroptimist Clubs. She was Assistant Chairman of the Republican National Committee and served as a member of the committee for many years.

Mrs. Priest is also an author. *Green Grows Ivy* is her autobiography, written during the latter portion of her years as Treasurer of the United States.

Mrs. Priest married Sidney W. Stevens, Beverly Hills realtor, in 1961. Her late husband, Roy Priest, died in June, 1959. She has three children—son Roy Baker Priest and two married daughters, Nancy Priest Valenzuela, AX, and Pat Priest Jensen, AX, and three grandsons.

with their fellow man. They must be brought to know just how great the demands and the responsibilities are on them as individuals in society. Many of them will travel toward still higher educational goals and the journey will bring them to still greater opportunities to be more than what they are now or what their forebears ever were.

Throughout the United States this spring there will be a bumper crop of graduates at all levels of education. Economic forecasts tell us that those who are properly qualified will find more jobs than they can fill, at the highest starting salaries ever offered. With jobs more profitable and plentiful and the hours shorter, there will be more time for man to contemplate his surroundings, his society, and his place in it. There will be more opportunities for him to make a better world.

There is not only a place but a need for an organization like Delta Zeta in this search of youth for a better world. Filling that place and meeting that need will be a stern challenge to all of us—from the youngest on-campus pledge to the most senior alumna. This challenge can be the stimulus on which Delta Zeta sisterhood will rise to its greatest heights—if we choose to make it so.



Alabama Mississippi



Arizona bears Navajo



Hand painted programs in the desert colors greeted the guests at the Arizona State Day luncheon on April 19 at the Francisco Grande Hotel in Casa Grande. Marshall Tame, a Navajo Indian born in Red Rock was the interesting speaker. A graduate of the University of Missouri, during World War II he translated the code into Navajo, and the Japanese never could break that code. Formerly a public relations man for the Navajo nation, he is now assistant project co-ordinator for the Arizona State University Indian Community Action project.

He explained that the Navajos live in hogans, as they did years ago, on the sixteen million acre reservation in the Four Corners area, Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado, and Utah. Ninety percent of the Navajos speak the native tongue. Language is their biggest barrier to learning.

Through the Office of Economic Opportunity, preschool programs have been developed. They are aided by Tribal Scholarships and federal grants if they wish to go on to college.







Cyndy Edwards

Niagara University


Niagara University, conducted by the Vincentian Fathers, was founded in 1856 on its present 110-acre site overlooking the gorge of the Niagara River.

Geographically, it is located on the Northern outskirts of the City of Niagara Falls, New York. It can be reached by either the Niagara Expressway or the Robert Moses Parkway.

Niagara is co-educational and has a total enrollment of 2,644 undergraduate and graduate students. Residence halls on the campus accommodate 1,000 men and dormitories for women, located in the City of Niagara Falls, house approximately 486 coeds. The ratio of male students to female is 3 to 1.

Recent expansion is apparent with the construction of the DePaul Hall of Science, Our Lady of Angels Library, and O'Shea Hall, a high-rise men's dormitory dedicated two years ago. Presently a women's dormitory is under construction.






Jane Glanzer, BΣ, and Monte Watson, AKA model for Fort Collins Benefit Fashion Show.



Visitors browsing through the displays of art work at the Art and Antique Show given by alumnae, mothers and members of Alpha Tau chapter.







This fall, the Sacramento Hearing Society will initiate a pilot program for new-born hearing screening in one of the local hospitals and \$300 was given to help get this started along with time volunteered by ΔΖ Alums to help with this screening. Money was given to the Glenna Stevens World Games for the Deaf Fund to help Glenna, a Sacramento girl and member of Will's Spikettes track and field team, to attend the International Games for the Deaf in Belgrade, Yugoslavia.



A chance remark was made at a PTA meeting some years ago by a St. PETERSBURG Junior High principal to Sheena Johnson AX that "children didn't know how to spell and didn't even care" and what was needed was a spelling bee." St. Petersburg Delta Zetas presented his school a plaque. Judges for the County Bee were Eunice Moe, ΑΣ, Shirley Waggoner, O, Gay McNaughton Shirley, ΘΔ, and Winifred Bryant, Θ. At the regional Suncoast Bee, Delta Zeta judges were Marylou Leimgruber Appleton, AA, and Mrs. Bryant. All the St. Petersburg ΔΖs are hoping young Patras returns from Washington as the national champion speller.



The audience was alive—not with sound, but with motion. A sandy-haired boy turned to his date and moved his hand in quick, intricate movements, recording his interest in the activity on stage.

For this unusual dance concert, the announcer spoke out loud, but used hand motions simultaneously to explain each number. At Gallaudet College for the deaf, a modern dance concert is an unusual experience.

Last spring Washington, D.C. Alumnæ chapter held their fifth benefit as sponsor of one night's performance by the physical education and athletics students. Dr. Peter R. Wisher, instructor, used the students of the liberal arts college to present a program which featured the rich heritage of dance in America.

The difference was that none of the students could hear the music to which they danced. At best, some of them could catch a basic rhythm.

"I would estimate that they can hear about two percent of what we hear."

He said the students count out the beats used to determine their dance movements and react to each other.

"The range of hearing varies with each individual," he said. "What they do is respond to a basic beat. We practice with a drum, which I beat to the rhythm of the melody. Then we alternate music, then drum, then music, until they know their steps."

The Delta Zetas and other guests in the audience were fascinated by the lively, intricate interpretations. Performing a square dance, doing a waltz, and executing a tango, the students seemed very much in step.


Money raised by the concert admission prices is returned to the Gallaudet through the Washington Alumnæ philanthropy work. A scholarship fund has been established in Delta Zeta's name by the Alumnæ.

The concert is always one of the most fascinating projects for alumnæ, according to outgoing President, Ann McGinnis. This year, the Gallaudet group performed two numbers which have become classics not only for the deaf but the hearing as well. "Life is a Symphony of Sounds" and "They say I'm Deaf" are based on the language of sign used by the deaf in communication.

In 1968, members of the group performed these two numbers at the National Democratic Convention and on the nationally televised Mike Douglas show.

During intermission, D.C. Alumnæ presented the President of Gallaudet, Dr. Leonard M. Elstead, with a tie tack, decorated with the Delta Zeta crest. Dr. Elstead will retire during the summer of 1969.

The performing students also made a presentation. They surprised Ann McGinnis with a plaque, given to the Delta Zetas as a token of their thanks for Alumnæ work.



But most gratifying to any Editor is having three of the Summer issue personalities making headlines elsewhere.

The June 18 newspapers all over the country carried a picture of Janette Litten, OP, with President Nixon at a white house ceremony where she was one of four teenagers receiving the Young American Medals. Our June issue carried her story.

Dorothy Nichols Dolbey, EI, who wrote "Search for Identity" in the June issue, has since received the Degree of Doctor of Humane Letters from her alma mater, the University of Cincinnati. Her citation read:

"In almost every area of endeavor, her many years of selfless devotion to the Cincinnati area and its inhabitants have been inspirational and worthy of honor. Among other well-deserved accolades, she has received the City of Brotherhood Award of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, the Isaac M. Wise Temple Good Neighbor Award, and an American Broadcasting Company National Citizenship Citation. A leader in local politics, she served with distinction as a member of the Cincinnati City Council for four terms, has been the only woman elected as Vice Mayor, and for eight months, served as Acting Mayor. Church affairs long have occupied much of her remarkable and energetic attention, as attested by her terms as President of the Cincinnati Council of Church Women and of National Church Women United. Numerous civic developments owe much to her initiative and wise guidance, and among her most noteworthy contributions was her strong and effective endorsement of the modernization of the Cincinnati General Hospital and its integral affiliation with the University Medical Center."


