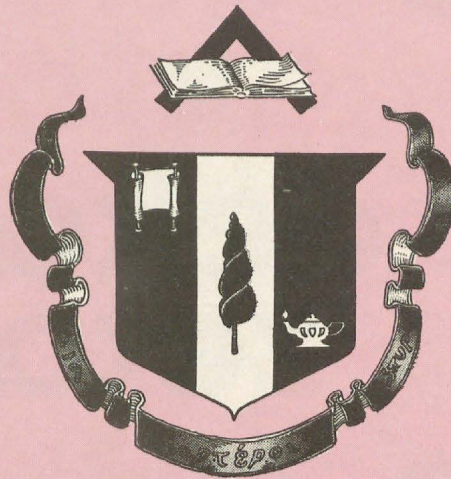

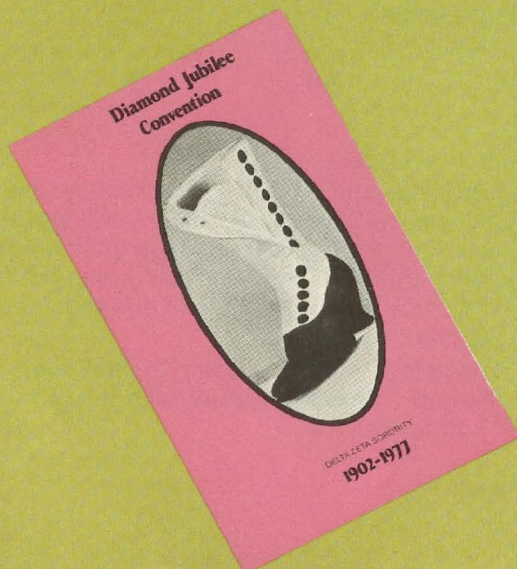

Diamond Jubilee

National Council officers in their turn-of-the century gowns and parasols delighted the delegates to Delta Zeta's Diamond Jubilee Convention as they entered the ball room of the Sheraton-Columbus for the opening banquet on June 18.

Centerpieces of ivy in high-buttoned rose and white shoes designed by the Dayton Alumnae chapter were lit by individual hobnail candle holders with fragrant rose candles. The first course of the banquet was a pineapple surprise with a candle on the top of each plate.

Lois Westerman Shrank, Θ—Ohio State, painted the huge mural behind the speakers table depicting Miami in 1902 with the founding of Delta Zeta.

Betty Heusch Agler, Past National President, presided, and the invocation was given by Grace Mason Lundy, Honorary Chairman of the Diamond Jubilee. President Florence Hohnbaum Harvey likened the delegates in her address to *Acres of Delta Zeta Diamonds*, which she had chosen as the theme for this Diamond Jubilee Convention.

The 1902 mood was heightened by the songs of the Bowery Boys quartet in nostalgic costumes.

A surprise presentation by Pamela Huber to the Delta Zeta national archives was the original charter of Delta chapter. The first charters of new chapters were given by Alpha chapter, and this was the last one given by them, and the only one that has survived. Later charters were granted by Delta Zeta Sorority, the national officers and not the Miami chapter. The precious Delta charter will be hung in

Headquarters, and a replica framed for the Delta chapter house in Greencastle.

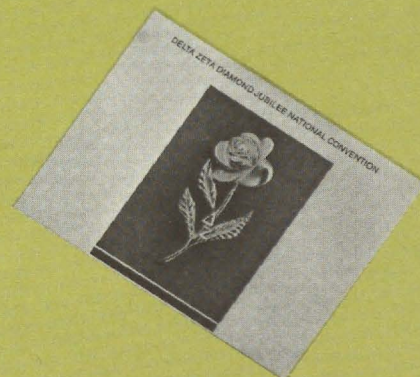

The Alice Huenefeld gold bracelet given to an outstanding College Chapter Director was awarded to Linda Agler Hobbs, Θ—Ohio State. Last convention's winner, Lenna Parker, ZZ—West Texas, was presented with a replica since the original bracelet is a travelling award.

Following the banquet, a reception was held around the pool, where everyone had a chance to meet the members of National Council.

A DAY AT MIAMI

After breakfast on Sunday, delegates and visitors were transported by bus to Oxford and the Miami campus. Alpha chapter members in their red and white outfits conducted tours of the campus and pointed out all of the spots historically interesting to Delta Zetas. The convention picture (see center fold) was taken on the steps of the Center for Performing Arts. Everyone lunched in Harris dining Hall, and continued with a walking tour of the campus, and a restful stop to see a movie on Miami's history.

The famous Miami barbecue picnic was served on the South Quad, followed by the evening's program. The tall pillars of McCracken Hall served as an impressive backdrop. Mary Lou Barth, an Alpha member herself, introduced the speakers. Lucile Crowell Cooks, also Alpha, gave the invocation, with Dr. Phillip Shriver, Miami's President, welcoming everyone. Delta Zeta's gifts to the University on the occasion of the Diamond Anniversary were two. The first was a portrait of Lucile Cooks, the first woman to serve as President of the University's Board of Trustees, and the second a flagpole with two flags to stand in front of the new International Building.

The program concluded with the announcement of the first six Founders Memorial Scholarships to Marsha Johnson, ZB—Wisconsin Stout, Jane Moore, ZP—William Jewell, Susan Lennon, Θ—Ohio State, Tara Muhlhauser, Y—North Dakota, Leanne De Shong, EP—Northwest Missouri, and Bobbe Rasmussen, IB—Dickinson.

As a fitting end to this return to Miami seventy-five years later, Delta Zetas filled the lawn with a huge Friendship Circle, and the campus echoed to the singing of *Delta Zeta Lamps are Burning*.

BUSINESS SESSIONS

The Monday morning business session opened with the seating of delegates from the new college and alumnae chapters. Introductions were made of present and former Council members, committee chairmen and convention committees. The minutes of the 32nd national convention were approved, and the executive committee reported that five National Directors would be nominated. Grace Mason Lundy then gave the report of the nominating committee, and designated the time limit for any floor nominations.

PUPS AND HOUNDS

The traditional Pups and Hounds luncheon found delegates wearing rose and green checked dog collars, with doggie bags decorating the tables. Arlene Neuman, disguised as Snoopy, presided over the fun. The Texas contingent performed an original skit in which they "arfed all night." Fun awards were given one going to the youngest pup there, Susan Bass, 13 year old daughter of Sondra Bass. Lucile Cooks was the Barking Competition Coordinator, and enlivened the barking competition with her comments as she introduced the groups attending the many conventions. Grace Lundy was again winner of the contest with 25 conventions to her credit. Runners-up were Florence Miner with 22 and Frances Westcott who woofed 21 times.

Afternoons at convention were devoted to workshops for collegiate and alumnae members. The alumnae held their first at the Governor's Mansion, with the Columbus alumnae hostessing a lovely tea.

INITIATION

Ionic columns flanked banners of white with Lamps of gold as a backdrop for the Initiation banquet of Vice President Norma Minch Andrisek. The tables were centered with miniature white columns surrounded by Delta Zeta roses. At each place was a screen of transparent plastic imprinted with a replica of the Delta Zeta badge and the words of the creed, *To myself Faith that I may walk truly in the light of the Flame*.

Grace Lundy told the history of convention initiates. Norma Andrisek introduced the evening's initiate, Kimberly Gary, a pledge from the Slippery Rock chapter, who is the daughter of Vice President Marilou Lynch Gary. Grace's own daughter Cynthia had been a convention initiate.

The coveted Caryatides awards for excellent pledge training programs were presented by Marilou Gary to Epsilon-Indiana, Epsilon Gamma-Central Missouri, Kappa Psi-Shippensburg, Theta Xi-Glenville, Epsilon Kappa-Wisconsin Whitewater, Theta Gamma-New Hampshire.

Grace Lundy introduced the former GML girls in attendance, and then announced this year's winners. Senior girls to receive this award were Carrie Goodrow, KA—Nicholls, Gail Lutz, KΨ—Shippensburg, Patricia Lynch, ΔΔ—Georgia State, Joan Richards, ΔΥ—Marshall, Kathryn Rouse, ΔΘ—Houston, Donna Sonaggera, ΔΦ—NE Oklahoma, and Deborah Whiteus, A—Miami.

The Berea alumnae were in charge of the banquet arrangements, and the members of Gamma Alpha chapter at Baldwin Wallace sang old and new Delta Zeta songs to set the mood for the beautiful initiation that followed. Alpha chapter members performed the ritual for the initiation of Kimberly Gary, and all of those attending renewed their vows with her.

Later that evening National Council received delegates and visitors informally in the Governor's Suite of the Sheraton.

Each evening province members alternated receiving and visiting with other provinces so that everyone had a chance to get acquainted.

MEMORIAL SERVICE

Early morning Memorial services were held Tuesday in the Old Trinity Episcopal church on Capitol Square. As the magnificent organ played Delta Zeta songs, Gwen Moss McKeeman conducted the services for those sisters who had joined the Flame Eternal since last convention. As their names were called their chapter delegate came down the aisle and placed a rose in the urns beside the altar.

Donna Borgmeyer and Cathy Lieurance of Iota Xi chapter at Missouri-St. Louis opened the Tuesday business meeting with the Delta Zeta creed interpreted in both words and sign language.

Committee reports were given and Charlotte Freygang, BΩ—New York, instructed the delegates on voting procedures.



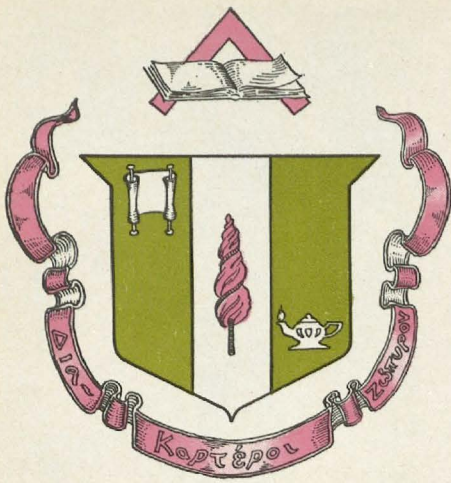

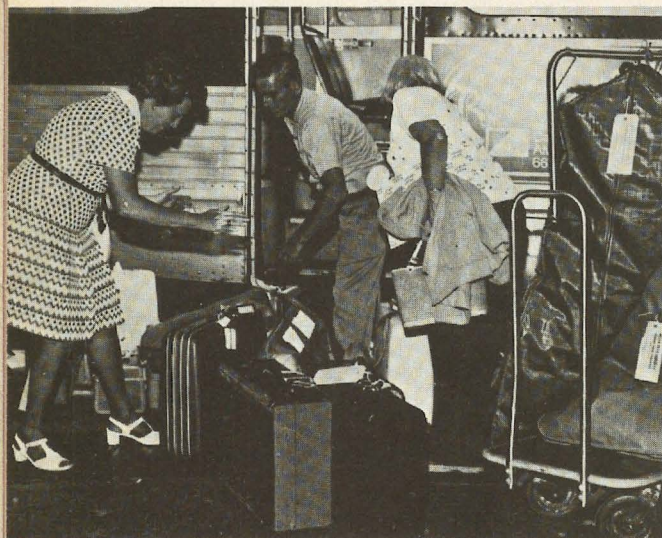

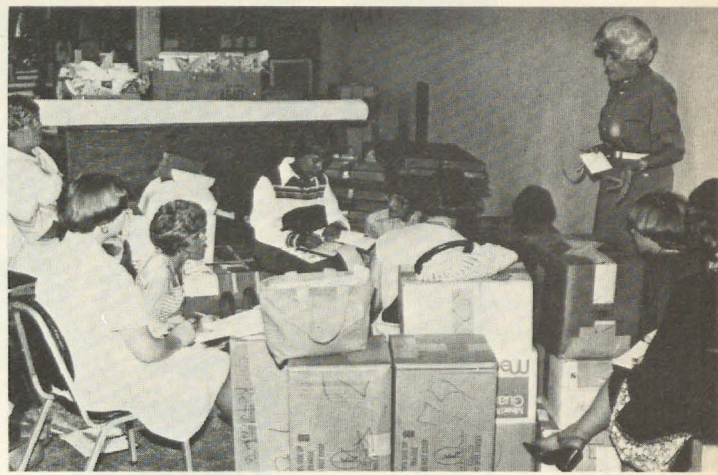

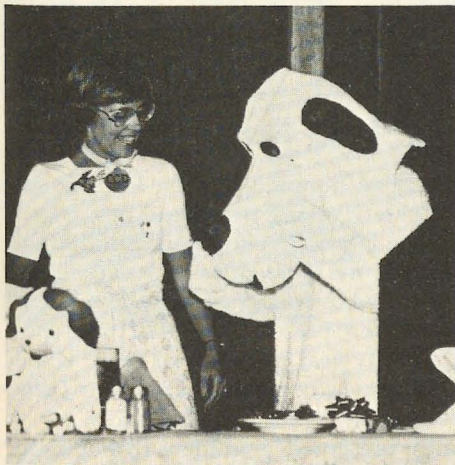

"We now take the first steps toward our Centennial. They will be more certain than those earlier steps for we walk now on a firmer foundation. The path will not be smooth for there will be obstacles along the way. In taking these steps we must never forget our reason for being. Delta Zeta must be a living, growing thing. It must be purposeful. It must be meaningful. It must be fun. It must bring joy.

"As we make this new beginning I would share three things with you—a wish, a challenge and a prayer.

"The wish is in a favorite poem.

*I cannot give you cloudless skies,
A life that's free from cares and sighs,
But I can wish you a heart that sings
And the joy of discovering beautiful things.
I cannot give you wealth or fame,
But I can wish you just the same.
Laughter, love, friendly faces,
And golden moments the heart embraces.*

"May this wish come true for you.

"The challenge is in our pledge to one another—mine to you that I promise my energies, my ability and my devotion to you and to Delta Zeta. Yours to Delta Zeta—that you will always give of your best self—wherever you may be and in whatever you may do. While the spotlight is often on your National Council, it is but a small part of Delta Zeta. Delta Zeta's heart is out there where you are, and only with your help can we walk together.

"The prayer—Dear Lord, give us a new peace and a better and more tolerant understanding of one another as we endeavor to dedicate ourselves to our Delta Zeta sisterhood. Help us, each one, to represent Delta Zeta in the most honorable way. Sustain our faith, that we may walk truly in the light of the flame.

"As we leave, let us not forget that Delta Zeta now is you and me. What we do with Delta Zeta is what Delta Zeta will be."

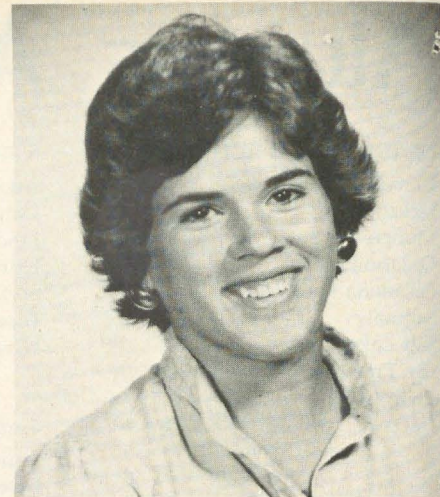

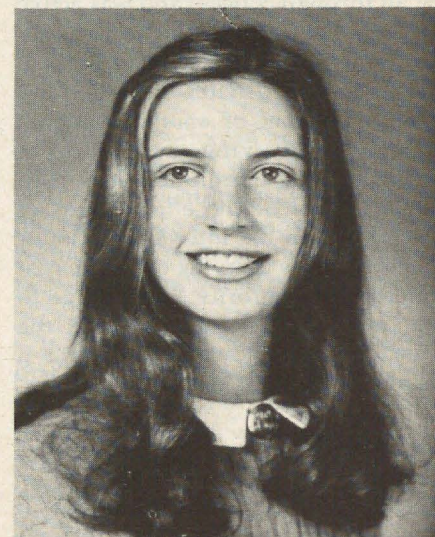

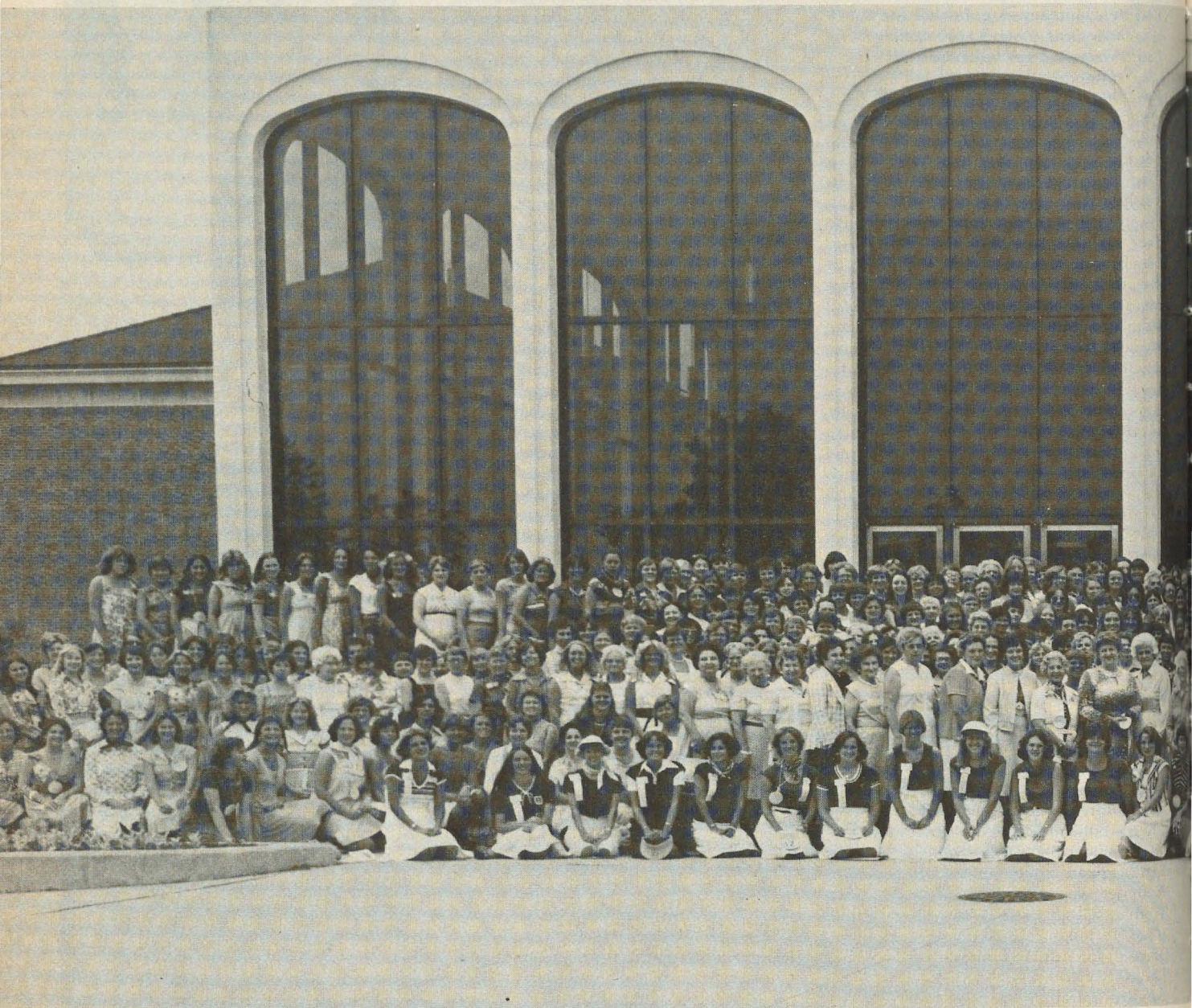
