


RUSH IS THE LIFELINE OF EVERY DELTA ZETA CHAPTER.

Each year serves as a "new beginning." What can each Delta Zeta member and chapter do to ensure success in charting a positive course for the future? How can we make our formal rushes distinctive? In what ways can we be certain that Delta Zeta is always first and foremost in a rushee's mind? Successful rush requires organization, advance planning, practice and the total commitment of the entire chapter.

ORGANIZATION THROUGH ADVANCE PLANNING IN CHAPTER WORKSHOPS

Organization is essential to a successful formal rush. Plans must be specific and must be made one term in advance. In other words, chapters having fall formal rush need to be prepared before school closes in the spring.

Enthusiasm is fostered when all members and advisors are involved in the planning stages. People tend to support what they help create. An evaluation should be made regarding the prior formal rush to determine changes that accentuate strengths and deal realistically with weaknesses.



During the planning workshops, committees and their chairmen should be selected for each rush party period. These committees are responsible for planning and implementing each phase of the party. The Rush Chairman must serve as a "manager." She cannot do rush alone. A major weakness that may lead to possible disappointment is when the Rush Chairman tries to do everything herself and, unfortunately, the chapter allows her to do it! Rush takes cooperative teamwork. All facets of the party from nametags, decorations, displays, backdrops, favors, chapter costume or dress, menus, serving, to rentals need to be completed on a timely basis. Auditions should be held with parts assigned for those skits, ceremonies and musical groups. Scripts need to be distributed in order to have parts memorized. Rush songs for all party periods need to be rehearsed. Keep in mind that every detail should be coordinated to a theme that creatively and effectively SELLS Delta Zeta.

Along with party preparation, an educational process must take place. Special attention should be given to Delta Zeta 'facts and figures', Panhellenic rules, Delta Zeta rush regulations, legacy policies and attendance requirements. Conversation and rotation techniques need to be practiced. In the summer, informational packets should be mailed with reminders, updates, pre-rush and rush schedules.

ALUMNAE INVOLVEMENT

Rush does not stop after graduation for alumnae. There are numerous ways alumnae may assist chapters whether they live in a college community or many miles away. Talk about your experiences as a Delta Zeta to high school women and to their parents. Encourage them to go through rush. Send references on those fantastic women who are going to campuses where there are Delta Zeta chapters. Be a part of Alumnae Panhellenic or if there is not one in your area, even better, help start one! Offer your home for rush parties or be willing to assist in any way during





rush. Serve as a Rush Advisor. Bring snacks during rush work week. Lend your variety of talents that range from sewing costumes, choreographing skits, painting sets to doing calligraphy. Send a "best wishes — thinking of you" note or floral bouquet. Alumnae are the much needed, caring support system for all our collegiate chapters. As collegians we stress that Delta Zeta involves a lifetime commitment so let's put these words into practice!

WORK THE PLAN BY PRACTICING

The excitement builds as chapter members return to campus for formal rush. Pre-rush work week is a time to add those finishing, polishing touches to each party. It is also a time to strengthen those bonds of sisterhood by working together to accomplish worthwhile goals. Though the pace may become hectic, time should be given for breaks after specific assignments are completed each day. A "Spirit Committee" can keep the morale up. Their planning of skits, mock awards, snacks, prizes interspersed with lots of surprises promote an enthusiastic 'togetherness.'

During pre-rush work week each party is practiced from entrance to exit, over and over again, with all members participating. Timing is of critical importance with every minute needing to count for Delta Zeta through rush conversation and systematic rotation patterns. Knowing what to do when allows for a natural, relaxed, self-confident, poised chapter.

An equal emphasis must be placed on each party. It is extremely unwise to concentrate on one or two parties and neglect the others. Skits, ceremonies and songs should be rehearsed until they are of "Oscar" or "Grammy" award winning quality.

Endless hours are spent in planning each party to the finest detail, working on decorations and rehearsing entertainment. However, the most important factor of rush cannot be overlooked and that is conversation. Rushees have signed up for rush to learn more about sororities. It is our privilege to tell them about the benefits of our sisterhood. In our conversations we are the authorities on

Delta Zeta. We must be informed about all aspects of the sorority. This comes through listening, learning and practicing the art of conversation.

AT LAST — RUSH!

In the days to come, each party shines with a special radiance. A genuine pride comes forth in sharing individual and campus honors, Delta Zeta friendships, memorable traditions and significant events. A special effort is made to tell about the immense opportunities available through Delta Zeta membership in the areas of academic support, leadership development, chapter programs and campus involvement. In turn, our members find out about the rushee's interests and what she is hoping to gain through sorority membership. We show the advantages of being a Delta Zeta, how she will fit into the total chapter and why Delta Zeta is the sorority that will enhance her life. The conversation displays a caring, honest and sincere attitude toward the rushee.

Formal rush ends. Our Circle of Friendship has grown as we have a QUOTA PLEDGE CLASS! Through careful organization, planning, practice and enthusiastic participation the most intense, visible part of rush has been successful.

But . . . what about the other days of the year? Formal rush is over, yet rush is a continuous, ongoing process. We must be consciously aware at all times of how we project ourselves to the campus, community, alumnae, parents, and even our own sisters. Our day-to-day actions reflect our commitment and pride in Delta Zeta. This is how we "rush" Delta Zeta every day.

Each member, whether collegian or alumna, can make that special individual difference. Every Delta Zeta chapter, collectively, must be committed to maintaining a membership which equals or surpasses the maximum size allowed on campus. RUSH IS THE LIFELINE OF DELTA ZETA. It is your gift to the future of our sorority.

ALWAYS JUST RIGHT . . . DELTA ZETA IS EVEN BETTER

Have you seen the cereal commercial about "Just Right?"

"Just Right" is even better! Two people discuss the name. Should it remain the same or be called "Even Better." This ad, like so many you've seen, announces something new and improved.

Well, guess what? Now, it's Delta Zeta's turn to announce something new and improved — the Delta Zeta Foundation.

Remember, we as members of Delta Zeta are committed to her values and vision. Because of our commitment, Delta Zeta's leadership has taken a bold new thrust to focus clearly on our sisterhood, taking Delta Zeta through the '90s and into the 21st Century, with all the resources needed for an enriched sisterhood.

To foster the creation of Delta Zeta resources for the '90s and beyond, your leadership has taken the initiative to put the encouragement of all Delta Zeta philanthropic support under the new Delta Zeta Foundation.

With the Foundation as our guiding star, all philanthropic monies and gifts to the Sorority will be channeled through this single source. In turn, the Foundation will provide financial grants to both the Sorority and Museum for such purposes as designated or requested.

Basically two changes have taken effect. One, the scope of philanthropic opportunities has increased to include all Delta Zeta educational programs and projects — not just scholarships, hearing and speech projects — and the Museum. Secondly, the Foundation provides the means for all Delta Zeta donors to continue their support, but through a more well-defined cohesive program.

With good information from Delta Zetas across the country, the Council knew confusion existed when different branches of Delta Zeta corresponded with them at different times of the year, especially for fund raising. To address this issue, the National Council established the Financial Resources Committee, comprised of the presidents and representatives from the Sorority, Foundation and Museum. The members are Patricia Rosser, Chairman; Deanna McKinnon, Carolyn Gullatt, Norma Andrisek, Joan Lowry, Elizabeth Devereaux and Cynthia Winslow. The mission of this committee is to advance Delta Zeta's purpose of personal growth and sisterhood through the development of philanthropic resources on a sustaining, enrichment and endowment basis, accomplishing this in a clear and effective manner.

The committee members first met in December, 1987 for a full weekend of brainstorming, planning, and dreaming of Delta Zeta's future. The committee developed goals to establish a shared vision of the Sorority's

future and a shared vision of how to find that future. These goals will be accomplished through the process of "friendraising" and fundraising carried out by members and friends of Delta Zeta, directed, supported, and assisted by the committee members as authorized by the National Council of Delta Zeta.

At the February Council session, the committee presented its goals and plans to the National Council and the Foundation Board. They were unanimously adopted.

Here are the key goals and new programs in this ambitious venture.

I. Volunteer Talent: The strength of the Sorority depends on the quality and quantity of volunteers serving in key positions. The new volunteer organization will provide a broader range of opportunities for leadership and service, enhanced volunteer training, volunteer utilization and volunteer evaluation.

II. Donor Recognition: In order to more appropriately recognize the generosity of Delta Zeta donors, new giving levels have been established with appropriate recognition for each level. Previous donors will be incorporated into the new giving levels shown on the pyramid chart. The Heritage Club, Rose Society, and Founders Guild have been established for individual donations. The Founders Associates recognizes corporate gifts; while the Codicil Club recognizes those who remember Delta Zeta in their wills. The Presidents Associates is for collegiate and alumnae chapter recognition. Gifts in memory or honor of others are recognized in the Commemorative Club with its special Book of Honor. The Colonnade Club will recognize the generosity of those parents who support Delta Zeta.

III. Information Exchange: Good communication leads to understanding, understanding fosters support, and support enhances our sisterhood. Good communication will be the keystone in our "friendraising" and fundraising efforts. Existing publications will be improved and new publications will be created to meet the needs of Delta Zetas. There will be a new look to the Foundation logo. Each year a full annual report will be produced and given to each donor.

IV. Tours: An exciting tour program will begin in 1988 offering sun, fun, and friendship to our members. See the March 1988 issue of *THE LAMP* for details.

V. Gift Opportunities: Everyone likes choices, and the quality and quantity of the choices make a difference. A key element in the new program will be an expanded menu of giving opportunities that will allow each Delta Zeta donor to support an opportunity that meets her specific philanthropic objective.

Delta Zetas will still be able to support any and all of the programs and entities. If you want to restrict your donation, just specify when you send your donation. If not, the gift will be included in the Foundation's general funds and given as grants to specific needs and projects of the Sorority, its entities, organizations, and/or other areas of traditional support.

The following gift opportunities are samples of some of the areas identified for philanthropic support through the Foundation.

- A National Delta Zeta Conference Center in Oxford, OH. This will be comprised of the existing Museum, the newly acquired Maltby House and any future acquired property. This will house the Archives Program, National Administrative offices, and housing for conferences.
- An Archives program to preserve the historical material of the Sorority.
- Video series and accompanying educational materials to support the visions and values of Delta Zeta representing all areas of chapter programs and extension.

- Alumnae programming to provide continuing education for our alumnae chapters and clubs.

- Chapter consultant program to provide ongoing educational programs for our collegiate chapters and related personnel.

- Housing, specifically libraries or study areas.


- NMA Leadership Conferences to provide extensive training to the leaders of the collegiate chapters.

- Volunteer Development Training Seminars to provide ongoing educational training to the many volunteers involved in Sorority functions.

In summary, all "friendraising" and fundraising will be directed by the new and improved Delta Zeta Foundation.

"Just Right" will continue to get "better" because that's what Delta Zeta is all about. All of the Delta Zetas who have been part of this new program are fully committed to making it better. NPC Presidents Affirm Alcohol, Human Dignity Statements

Because of their concern over the use of alcohol, the national presidents of all 26 NPC groups have agreed to the following:

1. that we are opposed to the misuse of alcohol;
2. that all college chapters, all individual members, and all guests must abide by state, local, college/university laws and regulations;
3. that no college chapter funds may be used to purchase alcohol (Co-sponsors of social events are potentially liable regardless of how the expenses are shared.)
4. that it is inadvisable to host a party involving alcohol when the majority of guests attending are under legal drinking age.

Each NPC group has a national alcohol policy and is expected to abide by it. In addition, the national presidents expect their chapters to respect the regulations of any NPC co-sponsoring group.

We hope that this agreement will give college chapters the courage and ability to initiate discussion and formulate a Panhellenic stand on the subject of alcohol.

Because we believe college women should have a positive influence in the direction and achievements of the university community and activities should promote self-worth, human dignity, and a positive Greek image, the national presidents of the 26 NPC groups affirm

- that the dignity of the individual is a basic element of a civilized society and that dignity comes from a feeling of self-worth,
- that individual self-worth is a necessary factor in establishing healthy relationships between the sexes, and
- that sexual harassment of women to any degree is a detriment to building self-worth.

Therefore, we reject all activities, including competitive games, which are destructive, demeaning, abusive, which promote divisiveness among NPC member groups, or promote a negative image of the Greek community. The national presidents encourage the boycotting of such events.







Irene Caroline Boughton: 1904-1988

The long and happy association of Delta Zeta and one of her most dedicated members ended on March 8, 1988, with the death of Irene Caroline Boughton, Iowa-I.

For 38 years Irene Boughton served our sorority far beyond the call of duty as Executive Secretary. During that time she had come to symbolize National Headquarters for many Delta Zetas throughout the United States. Such were her talents of organization and leadership, that after eight years as Executive Secretary, Irene was elected National President in 1936, and she successfully combined that office and its responsibilities with her work at National Headquarters for two years.

Irene's talent for leadership first appeared when she was elected president of her chapter, Iota, at the University of Iowa. One year after her graduation she was serving Delta Zeta as a Province Director and as chairman of the National House Management Committee. Following the 1928 Convention, the National Council asked Irene to become Delta Zeta's Executive Secretary, a position she held until her retirement in 1966.

Moving when the headquarters office moved and keeping the sorority's records, statistics, etc. were two of the many facets of Irene's work, which also involved extensive travel for Delta Zeta; terms as editor of *THE LAMP* and later its business manager; attendance at the National Panhellenic Conference and serving as president of the NPC Central Office Executives; assisting with the mergers of four sororities into Delta Zeta during her tenure, and twelve years as a board member of the *THE LAMP* Fund.

Despite busy days and myriad responsibilities, Irene never lost her poise nor her sense of humor. Tall and tastefully dressed for every occasion, she made a lasting impression on rushees, pledges, and initiated members when she visited chapters to help with rush or for other events. Yet she thoroughly enjoyed opportunities

to chat informally with the chapter members, whether they be collegians or alumnae.

Irene managed to find time for community activities such as the National Board of Campfire Girls which presented her with the Luther

Gulick award for distinguished service. She was also an active member and officer of Altrusa International and served for a time on the Board of Trustees of the Indiana Women's Prison. She belonged to the Indianapolis alumnae chapter and was a regular player in one of its bridge groups. And she was active in the USO during World War II.

At the 1966 Convention when her retirement was announced, Irene was named one of the two charter members of the Order of the Laurel, the highest recognition in Delta Zeta.

Throughout her life and career as a member of Delta Zeta, Irene Boughton has indeed lived the tenets of our creed. She walked "truly in the light of the Flame."

A Memorial Service for Irene was held March 19, 1988, at the retirement center where she had lived in Indianapolis. The program was prepared by her closest friend, Frances Westcott, also a past National President of Delta Zeta.


