The photo, now identified, is one of a number in the Frank R. Snyder collection of the Smith Library of Regional History at Oxford's Lane Library branch. Inside, our picture book unfolds as each room depicts a different part of the adventure. After chatting and snacking on a child's delight of chocolate ice cream sundaes, our guests make a daring journey across Captain Hook's lagoon. They spy a sunken ship, treasure chests and a fountain with magnificent jewels. A crocodile looms in the background.

Wendy's bedroom is a welcome relief after crossing the fierce water. It is most inviting with an abundance of stuffed animals everywhere and would make anyone think twice about wanting to grow up. When all





are comfortably seated in white chairs with pink and blue bows the show begins.

Peter Pan and company entertain with the pros and cons of sorority life. Wendy and her two friends are in a dilemma about whether to go through rush. They get a preview of what some sororities may be like. Tiger Lily and her social tribe love to party while Captain Hook and his mighty buccaneers are tremendously rich and strict. The girls are not satisfied in what these two groups have to offer. Tinkerbell comes to their rescue by bringing in Peter Pan to help them find a true home. He encourages them to "really believe with all their heart and follow the golden flame to find a special place with friends and love." Of course, this is "Delta Zeta Land" where Peter Pan lives!

The sisterhood is stronger by having fun and working together.

Delta Zeta has returned to San Diego State University. A dream became reality for the young women of Gamma Omicron colony of the

Delta Zeta family when 68 proud young women were installed as founding members on February 19, 1989.

SDSU has over 35,000 students and is the largest university in California, offering bachelor degrees in 71 areas and the master's in 55. With 11 other sororities already on campus and plans to add another next year, interest in Greek life is alive on this sunny, southwestern campus.

The colony period for Gamma Omicron started with a flurry of activity. Official pledging occurred on October 14. By the next week the members were plunged into Greek life with participation in Derby Days where they made a strong impression, winning first in field games.

From that time on, they were used to being busy. They enthusiastically participated in Founders Day activities at the Doubletree Inn in San Diego, meeting area alumnae and becoming better acquainted with themselves.

Awards were given, including the

highest grade point average which went to Academics Chairman Diane Snyder who carried a 4.0 throughout the fall semester. Diane and sisters Greta Nutter and Jaimie Smith were elected members of SDSU's Greek Honor Roll.

Gamma Omicron members met their first official rush with the theme, *Color Me Delta Zeta*, using paint brushes and palettes full of bright primary colors. Because of the quality as well as the many hours of hard work, Gamma Omicron brought 18 new excited pledges to join their Delta Zeta family. The first ritual performed by the new initiates was the formal pledging of these young women.

In the short time these new sisters have been together, a true bond of friendship and belonging has grown among them. They experienced their first activity together as an installed chapter with Greek Week, which is a fundraiser for Multiple Sclerosis. The Delta Zetas made a strong impression, placing in many of the events, including overall spirit in the Greek games and showing everyone in San Diego how proud they are to be Delta Zetas!

# Focus: Value & Ethics

Is this fraternity?

- Woman student dies after falling from a third story ledge of the chapter house after being ordered to clean outside windows . . .
- "Traditional" drinking exercise results in death of freshman pledge . . .
- Four fraternity men arrested and charged with sale and possession of cocaine . . .
- Freshman drops out of school because of humiliation he suffered from treatment during a fraternity party . . .

Is this fraternity?

No, this is not fraternity. All too often, however, such activities are a result of fraternity hazing, in the mistaken idea that demeaning a pledge makes him or her a better active member of the group. Inappropriate action on the part of some individuals within the Greek system has produced negative publicity that is harmful to all.

Robert E. Manley, in *Fraternal Law*, says, "We are on the threshold of a period when the new minority group that is legitimate game for society to attack is the Greek world. We are on the verge of an era of Greek bashing on campuses across the country . . . Greek systems on every campus must straighten up their acts."

Those acts include alcohol and drug use, hazing, sexual abuse, declining scholarship and a lack of respect for themselves, their organizations and society.

National officers of individual sororities and fraternities have urged their memberships to follow the ideals espoused by their organizations. This has not always been as effective as should be expected. Perhaps this stems from a failure on the part of national fraternities to adequately provide their members with programs to combat problems facing today's college population.

It is for that reason, in an effort to lessen the disparity between fraternity ideals and individual behavior, and to personalize these ideals in the daily undergraduate behavior, that the National Interfraternity Conference (NIC) appointed the Commission on Values and Ethics. That Commission is charged with identifying and promoting fraternity principles relating to the undergraduate. These principles should prove exciting and beneficial to each individual member.

The Commission is chaired by Edward M. King, Sigma Chi, Director of Residential Life and Student Judicial System at Bradley University. Serving with him on the Commission are Judy Abrahamson, Alpha Phi; Jonathan J. Brant, Beta Theta Pi, Executive Director of NIC; Dr. Patrick I. Brown, Alpha Tau Omega, President of the NIC; Henry B. Poor, Executive Director of Psi Upsilon Foundation; Warren Richey, Sigma Nu, Director of Greek Affairs at Louisiana State University; Beth Saul, Alpha Epsilon Phi, Chairman of the National Panhellenic Con-

ference (NPC); Jean Wirths Scott, Pi Beta Phi; George W. Spasyk, Lambda Chi Alpha Executive Director; Gary R. Stone, Phi Kappa Sigma; and Dr. Ronald Taylor, Zeta Beta Tau.

Since the behavior of individuals reflects, both positively and negatively, on the fraternity system as a whole, the Commission will work to increase awareness of fraternity values through educational materials, programs, etc.

The following Basic Expectations have been developed by the Commission stating the fundamental guidelines by which fraternity men and women should govern their individual fraternal experiences.

## I

I will know and understand the ideals expressed in my fraternity Ritual and will strive to incorporate them in my daily life.

## II

I will strive for academic achievement and practice academic integrity.

## III

I will respect the dignity of all persons; therefore, I will not physically, mentally, psychologically or sexually abuse or haze any human being.

## IV

I will protect the health and safety of all human beings.

## V

I will respect my property and the property of others; therefore, I will neither abuse nor tolerate the abuse of property.

## VI

I will meet my financial obligations in a timely manner.

## VII

I will neither use nor support the use of illegal drugs; I will neither abuse nor support the abuse of alcohol.

## VIII

I acknowledge that a clean and attractive environment is essential to both physical and mental health; therefore, I will do all in my power to see that the chapter property is properly cleaned and maintained.

## IX

I will challenge all my fraternity members to abide by these fraternal expectations and will confront those who violate them.

## Focus: Values & Ethics (continued)

In an effort to develop an awareness and appreciation of these basic values, a discussion of the nine points is essential. These discussions should include undergraduates, chapter advisors and other involved alumni and college and university administrators. A retreat format of at least a full day would be the best approach in presenting a Values and Ethics Workshop. In another approach, a series of workshops, extending over several weeks, could be utilized.

Case studies have been developed for each of the nine areas of Basic Expectations. These are to serve as a starting point for the discussion of each area and will be distributed, along with other educational material and formats developed by the Commission, by the national organizations. In addition, host organizations should feel free to develop their own case studies and augment information received.

The work of the Commission has been developing

over the past year as a result of continuing concern over the direction being taken by Greek groups on various campuses. Alcohol abuse, negative public relations, image, scholarship and hazing have combined to confuse the goals of fraternal living, both within the organizations themselves and in the mind of the general public.

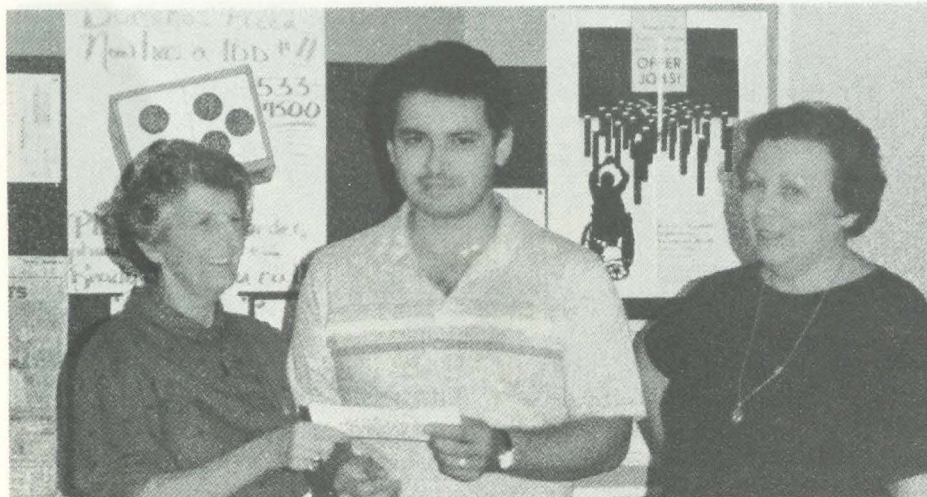
For this reason, men's and women's fraternities are working together to restore the original purpose of fraternity.

"We are hopeful," says Chairman King, "that efforts of the Commission, combined with those of NIC/NPC, will narrow the apparent gap between fraternal expectations and everyday reality. The Commission envisions a five to eight year period to implement this program."

# Foundation Presents Hearing Help Grants

The Delta Zeta Foundation provides Hearing Help grants which are given to alumnae chapters for use in their communities. Monies are provided to assist the deaf through education and/or action. The Foundation is happy to announce grants to the following alumnae chapters:

A \$500 grant has been awarded to **WHITTIER-WEST COVINA** alumnae chapter which works closely with Oralingua School for Hearing Impaired in Whittier, CA. Oralingua School was hit by an earthquake in 1987. The alumnae have helped with fund-raisers to assist in obtaining new playground equipment for the students. Additionally, alumnae make monetary contributions toward student scholarships. The chapter has worked with the school for nine years.

Another \$500 grant goes to **ST. PETERSBURG** alumnae chapter and their work with All Children's Hospital Speech/Language/Hearing Center in St. Petersburg, FL. The chapter's volunteers work every month, along

with Eckerd Drugs, in hearing screenings. They also raise funds with the intent of purchasing a tone generator for the hospital which would enable the audiology staff to test premature infants considered at risk for hearing problems. This diagnosis in infants can be crucial in determining a need for future treatment.

**WOOSTER** alumnae chapter has received a \$300 grant to assist them in work with Wayne County Speech and Hearing Clinic which the alumnae have assisted for ten years. In addition, the chapter provides hearing screenings for the community and tests pre-school children at three elementary schools. The nine members of this Ohio alumnae chapter gave a \$100 scholarship to a hearing impaired teacher in graduate school. The chapter is hoping to purchase an audiometer for the clinic as well as assist in purchasing office supplies.

The **COLUMBUS** (Ohio) alumnae chapter has been awarded a \$300 grant toward their work with Interpreting Services, Inc., a not-for-profit

agency which provides interpreting assistance for hearing impaired individuals. The chapter has worked with ISI for 2 years and volunteers about five hours of time weekly. One of the alumnae is Chairman of the Board for the agency and, as an attorney, has also contributed her legal services. The grant would help fund interpreting assistance to individuals who could not otherwise afford the service in hospitals, at doctor's appointments, or whenever this help could be used by the hearing impaired.

A \$200 grant was awarded **SAN FERNANDO VALLEY** alumnae chapter in their efforts to aid the National Center on Deafness located in Northridge, CA. Alumnae volunteer weekly clerical work at the Center which has been the focus of their philanthropic endeavors since 1980. The alumnae would like to restore and reframe paintings by deaf artists that have been donated to NCOD.

The Foundation has also given a \$200 grant to **BEREA** alumnae chapter for the past three years. The alumnae have worked closely with Westlake Developmental Center in Westlake, OH (see spring issue of *The LAMP* for a picture and article). Berea alumnae will also underwrite the cost for the Fairmont Theatre of the Deaf to present an in-school performance for the Westlake students.

**EL PASO** alumnae chapter has been selected to receive a \$200 grant for their work with El Paso Center of the Deaf in Texas. The chapter, which has worked with the center for three years, contributed to the purchase of a telecommunications device which was placed in the home of a deaf individual, enabling him to use the telephone as a means of communication.



# Mission Program in Peru

This is a story by Kimberly Whittle, DePauw-Δ, a senior who traveled on a mission program during the month of January as her winter term project. Kim, who just received Phi Beta Kappa, plans to attend law school after graduation.

There are so many things that we take for granted in the United States — such as electricity, running water, clean clothes, and a comfortable bed. I happen to like those things a lot. Two years ago a friend told me about a trip she was planning to South America. I told her she was crazy. Well, something made me change my mind and I decided to see if I could survive in the wild.

This past January I had the opportunity to leave modern conveniences behind and experience life in a Third World country. As part of DePauw University's Winter Term Mission Program, I traveled to San Andres, Peru and spent the month working with the Bora Indians. The stated purpose of the trip was to provide medical care for the Bora and help them build houses to relieve a severe overcrowding problem. However, I think we Americans benefitted more.

The work was hard. For the first week I resisted getting out of bed until another teammate forced me out by jumping on my bed! I did not see how my aching muscles would be able to take another day of hammering, sawing, and carrying lumber (all of the supplies were delivered at the riverbank — a good five minute walk from the village). I also found out right away that I was a walking delicacy for mosquitos.

All in all, though, I felt that the "uncomfortables" never overshadowed the great value of the trip. Somehow we always had the energy to play with the children of the village. My favorite memory is the day we taught them how to play baseball with a green orange and a two-by-four!

It did not take us long to adjust to the "primitive" conditions of the jun-

gle. For example, instead of jumping into the shower after a day of hard work, we jumped into the river. Of course, everyone was nervous for the first few days, imagining that everything that brushed up against our feet in the water was a piranah! After a month of eating rice and fish we also came to consider peanut butter and bananas delicacies.

The trip was an opportunity to see and do things that I may never have the chance to see or do again. I loved the miles and miles of the muddy Amazon, the huge plants and wildlife in the jungle, the brilliant colors and pungent smells that surrounded us in an Indian market. I will never forget the thrill of whitewater rafting in the Andes, the mysteries of Machu Picchu, and the openness of the Peruvian people.

I realize that this country has severe economic and political problems, not the least of which is terrorism. However, a military parade in Iquitos was the closest we came to seeing blatant evidence of these problems.

We are all very glad to get back to the United States, but I do not think that any of the students would pass up the opportunity to go back to Peru. I hope that political conditions are such that I can go back in five years and see how the Bora are doing, who is living in the houses we built and

how much the children have grown. My special friend Esteban will be six by then.

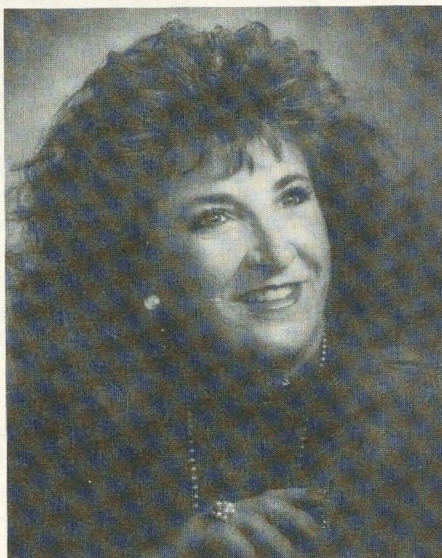

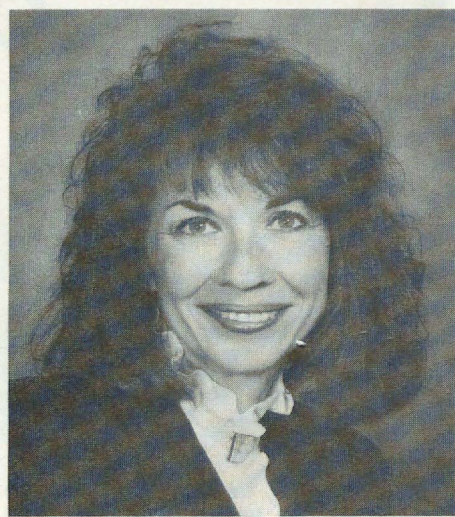

## CMV Hearing Losses are Identified with Equipment Donated by Delta Zeta

Cytomegalovirus (CMV) is a common virus harmless to most people. In fact, most adults and children who develop a CMV infection have no symptoms and are unaware that they have come into contact with CMV. CMV poses the greatest risk to developing fetuses, in some cases causing physical and developmental disabilities, including hearing loss. About 5,000 children born each year in the United States are mentally and/or physically disabled as a result of CMV infection.

One such child was recently evaluated at All Children's Hospital in St. Petersburg, Florida. This youngster is

3½ years old and is unable to respond to the traditional hearing testing as he is physically disabled and blind. He had been sedated and was tested by clinical audiologist Suzanne Holder with Auditory Brainstem Response (ABR) audiometry which is an objective, non-invasive method of providing information about the integrity of the peripheral auditory system.

The aim of ABR testing is to record the minute electrical potentials that arise in the auditory system as a result of sound stimulation. Part of the ABR Test System are INSERT HEADPHONES which provide for more accurate testing of infants and young

children. These headphones were donated by St. Petersburg alumnae chapter. Traditional headphones would collapse the tiny ear canals and in some instances make testing impossible and/or inaccurate at best.

Thanks to the donation of the insert headphones, this youngster has been identified as hearing impaired and rehabilitation services can begin immediately while speech and language behaviors are developing. 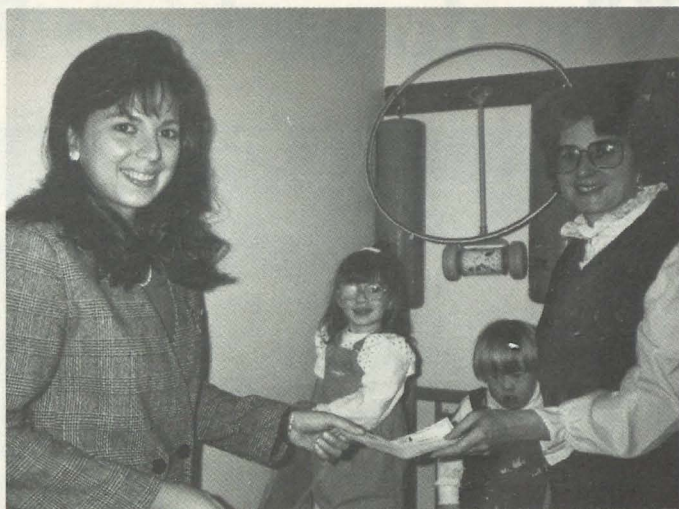

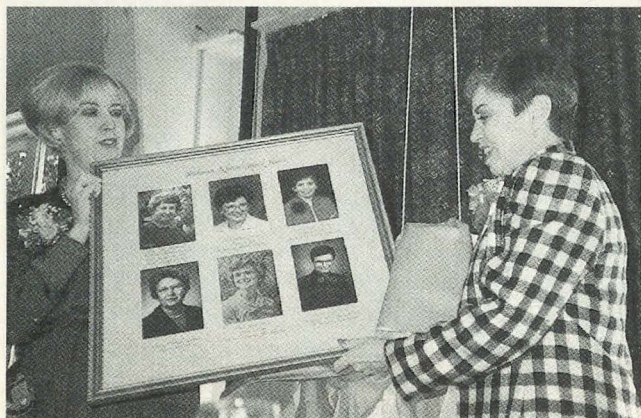

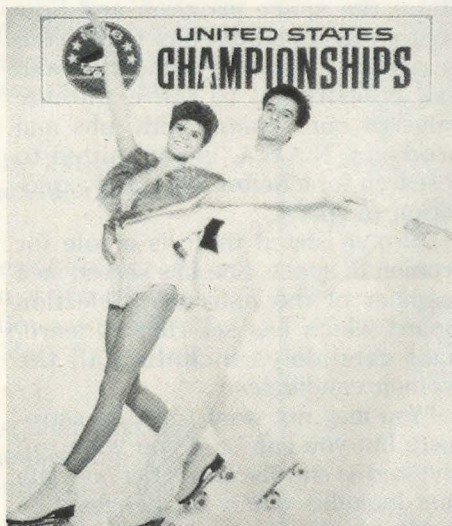

Committed to her work at the John-

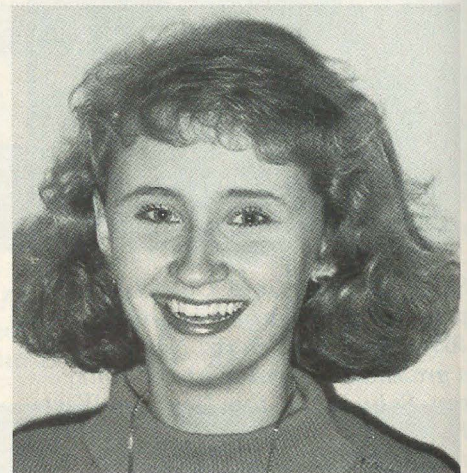

the night at a men's homeless shelter. There they serve food, wash clothes, and offer simple kindness.

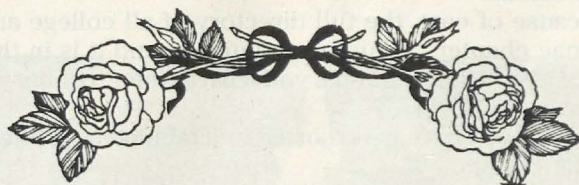

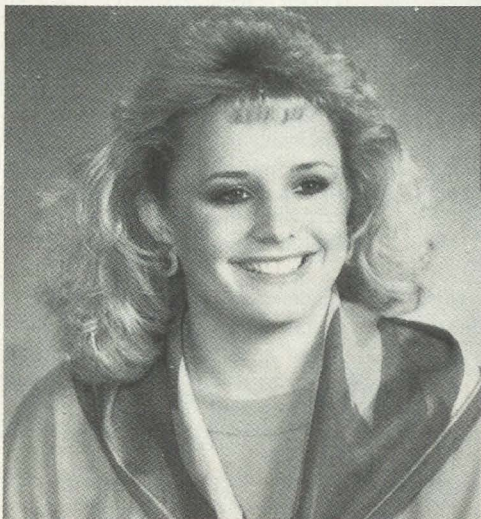

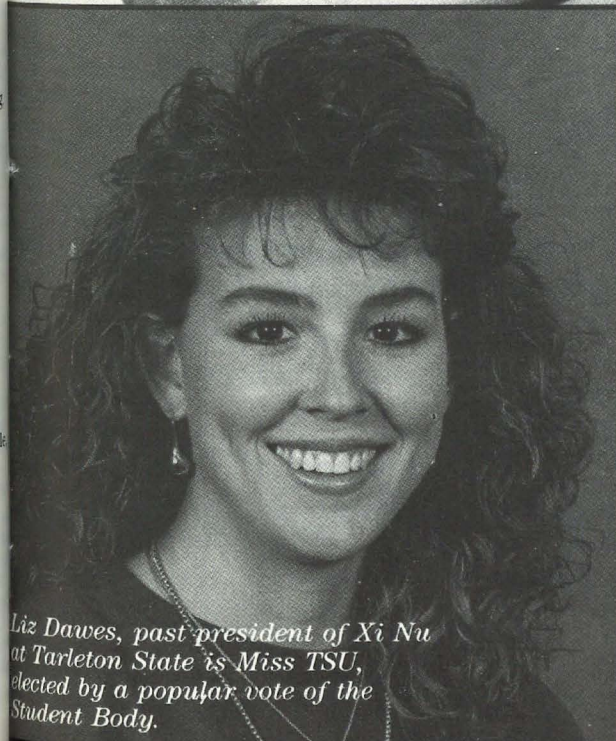
