





However, nothing could be further from the truth. In the summer, Delta Zeta Sorority is busier than ever. And this summer is one of the busiest.





Niki Norton accepted the position of CCD for the Beta Lambda Chapter at the University of Tennessee/Knoxville with great enthusiasm, and has set a wonderful example for the collegiate women. She says, "I felt I could help the women get the best out of their college life, because it comes and goes so quickly. I remind them every time I'm with them to cherish every moment, because you'll never forget your time in college with Delta Zeta."

Niki puts her heart and time into the chapter. She often attends several Delta Zeta functions a week, and meets with the Executive Board of Beta Lambda, attending weekly collegiate and monthly alumnae meetings, as well as Panhellenic meetings. She helps seniors with their resumes, assists students with organizational and time management skills, and encourages others who may have self-esteem issues.

Niki's encouragement to the chapter's Panhellenic delegate was rewarded when the Beta Lambda Chapter won the Panhellenic Involvement Award this year. She is truly the chapter members' friend and confidante. "I try to reach each of the collegians at a different level. I feel that if you can find some common ground with their schooling or extra activities, they begin to relate to you. Then they start to take advice, ask your opinion, and ask for help when they need it. There's this mutual respect that's so important."

A professional architect, Niki is an integral part of the Student Association Building Committee (SABC), which was formed at the University of Tennessee to provide better housing facilities for sororities. She serves as architect and as a representative of Delta Zeta. The university is working on its new master plan for the campus, which includes a new plot of land for Sorority Row, thanks to the SABC. "I feel that the alumnae can play such a big role in becoming great mentors to our collegians," Niki emphasizes. "It feels good that I helped with something in their life. Having a positive impact in their lives and knowing that I helped is the greatest thrill." We are fortunate to have Niki as our CCD in Knoxville, because she sets a wonderful example as a Delta Zeta alumna in her devotion to the women of Beta Lambda.

Joanne is a 17-year breast cancer survivor and works as a Reach to Recovery volunteer for The American Cancer Society. Reach to Recovery is a program comprised of breast cancer survivors trained to respond to the concerns of patients and their families facing diagnosis, treatment, and the effects of breast cancer. Joanne says cancer patients find that it helps to have someone to talk with who has been through the experience. "I have met some remarkable women through my volunteer work," she says.

"My husband of 41 years was also given a second chance in life. In July 1999, he was the recipient of a new kidney. As a result of this 'gift of life' experience, we have both become involved in LifeBanc. LifeBanc coordinates all organ and tissue donations in Northeast Ohio, resulting in the transplant of patients nationally and at four local transplant hospitals.

"My part in the program is educating four- to seven-year old children about their bodies. The program is interactive, with visuals and songs. I teach the children about their organs, where they are located, and what their organs do. We have songs and an 'organ apron' to show them what is under their bones and skin. We share different ways to keep our bodies healthy. I am a former teacher and truly enjoy interacting with the young children."

After facing her life-changing challenges, Joanne has learned to make every day count. "My experiences have given me a deeper appreciation of life," she says.






















On Campus With Delta Zeta







- The CARE Center and Clinic at the House Ear Institute has implanted over 350 children, and over 3,000 children worldwide use the cochlear implant.

The Gallaudet Dance Company held its spring dance performance in April of 2001. The program was entitled "Dancing into the Third Millennium: Celebrating Diversity." Tryouts and rehearsals prior to the performance were held at the Delta Zeta Dance Studio on the Gallaudet University campus.

The Dance Company, under the direction of Director Dr. Diane V. Hottendorf and Assistant Director Sue Gill-Doleac, is the country's leading organization for dancing by deaf people, and has a 90 percent graduation rate with dance company members who dance for at least two or more years with the company. The dancers have given shows throughout the United States and internationally. All performances rely on outside funding to continue.

The excellent reputation of the troupe has enabled the Dance Company to perform for former President and Mrs. Ronald Reagan, former President and Mrs. George Bush, and former President Jimmy Carter. The Gallaudet Dance Company's most recent television adventure was produced by Wisconsin Public Television, and is entitled "Everywhere, Everyone." The program aired on PBS in January of 2001.

Gallaudet University in Washington, D.C. is the world's only university with undergraduate programs accessible to hearing-impaired students. Through the Delta Zeta Foundation, we provide scholarship support for students and support the library and performing arts programs endowment funds. 
