



JOAN LOWRY IS WOMAN

oan Dondrea Lowry, Baldwin-Wallace College, Gamma Alpha chapter, has been named 1995 Delta Zeta Woman of the Year:

Joan was raised in Euclid, Ohio, and graduated from Euclid Senior High School. She went on to attend Baldwin-Wallace College where she majored in education. She did graduate work at Kent State University.

Joan was initiated into Gamma Alpha chapter in 1954. While in college, she served as pledge class president and chapter secretary, and was chosen "Dream Girl of Delta Zeta." Her other collegiate activities included class vice president, Student Council vice president, Homecoming court and head cheerleader.

Active in the sorority since she pledged, Joan has brought recognition to Delta Zeta through her professional and volunteer roles.

Professionally, Joan has been in the field of broadcasting for over 20 years. However, she originally started as a teacher. After taking time off when her son was born, she was unable to find a teaching job. Through agency contacts she had made as a teenage model, Joan landed the job as spokeswoman for such major companies as General Electric and Goodyear. This job led to radio and television commercials. She enjoyed the work so much that she enrolled at the Ohio School of Broadcasting. Joan is currently the Community Affairs Manager for Continental Cablevision in Ohio and the host of "North Coast Connection," a weekly television program. In this capacity, she interviews celebrities, as well as the nextdoor neighbor, and puts everyone at ease with her warm, charming personality. Joan has received several awards for her work in television, including the Telly Award in 1993. This award was given for Joan's work as narrator and producer of the documentary "Downtown Commons Project." In 1994, she also won the award for "Overall Commitment to Community" from the Ohio Cable Television and "Best Entertainment" and "Community Affairs" awards from the Cable Association.

Joan's professional memberships include Women in Communications, Women in Cable, Ohio Cable Television Association, National Television Public Affairs Association, Cable Television Public Affairs Association and National Association of Television Arts and Sciences. She is listed in Who's Who in America, Who's Who in the World, Who's Who in Entertainment and Who's Who in the Midwest.

As a Delta Zeta alumna, Joan has been vice president and president of the Berea, Ohio, Alumnae Chapter. She was named Ohio Delta Zeta Woman of the Year in 1987. On the national level, Joan has been National Standards Chairman, National Scholarship Chairman, National Philanthropy Chairman and served on the National Rush Committee. In June 1995, Joan completed twelve years of service on the Board of Trustees of the Delta Zeta Foundation. From 1987 to 1995 she served as the Foundation president.

As a member of the Foundation Board, Joan has been committed to Delta Zeta's philanthropy of speech and hearing. She has involved herself in improving the quality of life for the deaf and educating the public. Joan has worked tirelessly to inform those with hearing loss about their options for better hearing through surgery or the use of hearing aids.

Joan also believes in furthering the cause of better hearing with organizations that support the deaf and hearing impaired. In 1995, she was elected president for the Better Speech and Hearing Month Campaign. Twenty-eight organizations are involved in promoting public awareness through posters and magazine ads. Joan

This nationally produced film, narrated by LA Law star Richard Dysart and other celebrities, discussed hearing conservation and available hearing help. It has been shown on The Discovery Channel, BET Network, The Learning Channel, Lifetime, Kaleidoscope, Canadian Television and Continental Cablevision. According to the June 1994 issue of Better Hearing Institute News, "People Vs. Noise" has been seen by 124 million people.

The video spotlighted Joan and gave her credentials as not only a television personality, but also president of the Delta Zeta Foundation. Joan constantly strives to give recognition to Delta Zeta, so she asked that her segment be taped in the Delta Zeta Room at Kent State University.

Joan has also been active in the Better Hearing Institute. She has been on their Board of Directors for several years, and was elected treasurer in 1991. This PSA received an award for "Outstanding Public Service Announcement."

Joan is also involved with many organizations on a local and state level. She has volunteered with the Girl Scouts, Easter Seal Society, Salvation Army, American Heart Association, Animal Protection League and YWCA, to name a few. Known for her philanthropic work, she has received a "Service to Mankind" award from Sertoma International; a "Communications Award" from the Easter Seal Society and an "Outstanding Service" plaque

from the American Cancer Society. The Air Force has presented Joan with the highest award given to a civilian. In 1988, she received the "Community Leader of America" award. The Ohio House of Representatives presented Joan with a resolution commending her for her public service. Her own industry gave Joan an "Outstanding Service to Broadcasting" award.

To promote interest in entering the communications and government fields, Joan serves as a mentor in the Shadow Program in the Lorain City School District. She gives her time and talent to provide guidance to these high school students. Joan is also active in the alumni association of her alma mater, Baldwin-Wallace College, and served as president in the '70s.

Joan is married to her college sweetheart, Bob-Bill, Lambda Chi Alpha. They have a son, Christopher, a Beta Theta Pi from Miami University, now living in Cincinnati.


Heart-to-Heart Advice

everyone knows heart disease is a man's disease. The trouble is, everyone is wrong. Heart disease is the number one killer of American women. More than 500,000 women will die of heart disease this year, compared to 43,000 deaths from breast cancer and 55,000 from lung cancer.

Men have more heart attacks than women and men have them earlier in life. But women have lower chances of surviving them. What are the most important things a woman can do to reduce her risk of heart disease?

• Don't smoke. Smoking is a woman's biggest risk factor for heart attack. Cigarette smoke puts an added strain on the heart because it causes the blood vessels to clamp down or constrict.



- Maintain a healthy blood lipid profile. A high level of cholesterol in the blood can result in clogged arteries. The
 American Heart Association recommends that you have your blood cholesterol checked starting at age 20. Your doctor can use a simple blood test to measure your total blood cholesterol, your HDL (good cholesterol), LDL (bad cholesterol), and triglycerides.
- Get regular exercise. Heart disease is almost twice as likely
 to develop in inactive women than in those who are more
 active. The best exercises to strengthen the heart and lungs
 are aerobic ones like walking, jogging and swimming. But
 even low-intensity activities such as gardening and housework may lower cardiovascular risk if done daily. Control
 your blood sugar level if you have diabetes.
- Practice stress management. Simplify your life, get organized, let go of anger and hostility, and nurture your funny bone.
- Maintain a healthy weight. People who are obese are more likely to develop heart disease and stroke even if they have no other risk factors.

For post-menopausal women, estrogen replacement therapy looks very promising as a long-term protection against heart disease, but it may also promote the growth of certain cancers. You and your doctor together can decide whether the therapy is appropriate for you.

Miracles Do Happen

o you have a member of your family who abuses alcohol or drugs? I am a member of NAR-ANON. I am a member because my son is a cocaine addict. He has now been in recovery for almost two years. NAR-ANON has saved my sanity. COCAINE ANONYMOUS has saved my son's life. I would like to share my experience with you, because if there is anyone who needs help, I know the answer.

NAR-ANON is a self-help group. We learn how to take care of ourselves, not the addict. It helps families and friends of addicts who abuse any drugs — alcohol, cocaine, amphetamines, barbiturates, hallucinogens, tranquilizers, etc. At our meetings we learn that drug addiction is a disease. This is a medically proven fact. We share our problems with and get support from each other. We learn how to encourage the user to seek help. We learn how to take care of ourselves and improve our attitude and regain our own self-confidence. We learn to shed the guilt.

My husband and I attended our first NAR-ANON meeting four years ago. We thought that we would learn how to help our son. Instead we learned that only he could help himself. No one can help an addict except the addict. We did learn all of the things not to do to enable the addict.

Enabling or caretaking is the fundamental fault of family members. As long as we enable the addict, the addict continues on the downhill slide. When we pay the rent or the phone bill, bail them out of jail, co-sign on their loans, pay their fines, all in the name of "I'm only trying to help," we are providing the addict with money to continue using drugs.

NAR-ANON program is based on the 12 Steps of ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS. Most everyone is familiar with AA. The sister group is AL-ANON. The 12 Steps can be applied to any phase of your life, not just to a drug or alcohol problem. The change in you does not come immediately, it comes in time. To really follow the program

you must attend the meetings. I can hear you now. Why should I go to the meetings? I am not the addict. If you have an addict in your home, you are as sick as he/she. YOU ARE ADDICTED TO THE ADDICT. In NAR-ANON we learn to detach, live our own lives, let the addict live his/her own life and still love each other. We learn that a power greater than ourselves is in control. NAR-ANON does not support any religious organization, but we do learn a spiritual way of life. That is the power that sustains us.

My son had been seeking help for seven years. He had been in and out of many treatment centers. The miracle happened almost three years ago. He has been clean for 22 months. I heard him say recently that he is a recovered addict in the sense that he no longer craves cocaine. That is a miracle, for he had abused cocaine for almost 20 years.

Three years ago he became suicidal. He had reached the bottom of the down-hill slide. He then entered his fifth treatment center and has continued his recovery. He has become a responsible person, working, paying his bills and leading a normal life. My husband and I were attending our NAR-ANON meetings during the dark time. I could not have lived through the pain without the support of my husband and my friends in the program. There is no one in the outside world who understands the agony and pain family and friends suffer.

DO YOU NEED NAR-ANON?

- Do you find yourself making excuses, lying or covering up for your child or spouse?
- · Do you have reason not to trust your child or spouse?
- · Do you lie awake at night worrying about your child or spouse?
- Are your savings mysteriously disappearing?
- Does your whole life seem a nightmare?

YES, YOU NEED NAR-ANON.

Where do you find help? Almost every major city in the USA has either a NAR-ANON or CO-ANON program. If it does not, then AL-ANON is your next choice. You can look in the Yellow Pages under drugs. The hotlines are listed there. Many hospitals have recovery programs for addicts. Some can direct you to a 12 Step program in your city. Go to your local library and check out books on the subject by Melody Beattie. Educate yourself. Read every book you can find about drug addiction, enabling, recovery, co-dependency, etc.

There is help. There are miracles. I sought help and the miracle happened.

I remain your anonymous Delta Zeta sister.

Water — A Friendly Environment

Ater can be a most inviting friendly environment.

Remember how babies smile, kick and gurgle at bath times? Remember what fun it was as a youngster to wile away hours at the old swimming hole? Or perhaps you have memories of the relaxing joy of rhymthic lap swimming as an adult while toning muscles and relieving stress? Now as older adults with "twinges in our hinges" water can seem even more friendly.

Let me introduce you to the Arthritis Foundation YMCA Aquatic Program (AFYAP). This program can be found across the United States in YMCAs or public recreation facilities.

The exercises used in these classes are especially designed for the 40 million men, women and children in the United States who have arthritis. The certified instructor leading the class will caution you to go at your own pace while listening to your body. No swimming skills are required, your hair stays dry and your attire need not be stylish!

Although the AFYAP is called a recreational pro-

gram many participants may derive therapeutic benefits because

- water provides resistance which can help strengthen muscles. As joints deteriorate, muscles need to be kept strong to provide support for the joints.
- since water buoyancy assists our movements we can become real ballerinas as we put our joints through their range of motion-sweet mobility that we but dream about on land.
- when we are immersed in water to shoulder depth our hips and knees will feel but 10 percent of our body weight.
- the warmth of the water relaxes us and promotes blood circulation which nourishes our joints.
- most important of all, water classes lend themselves to sociability. Our twinges seem much more bearable with friendly faces surrounding us as we stretch, reach and go through our paces in a warm water environment.

So, check with your doctor to see if he/she, too, won't agree that water could be just the friendly environment for YOU! There is no cure for arthritis, but regular physician care, proper nutrition and exercise can help maintain health.

ou won't hear any lawyer jokes at a meeting of the Topeka, Kansas, alumnae chapter — that is unless the Delta Zeta lawyers are doing the telling! The fact is that 10 percent of the chapter's 21 dues paying members are lawyers, quite an accomplishment since only 26 members of the Kansas Bar Association are women! And, the chapter's 10 percent, Becky Beutler Miller, Delta Omega, and Martha Hodgesmith, Lambda, find time for Delta Zeta alumnae activities, as well as time for community service, family, and thriving legal careers.

Both earned their juris doctors at nearby University of Kansas, but neither started out at K.U. In fact, Becky first did undergraduate work on the opposite side of the state at Fort Hays; Martha began her undergraduate work at K.U.'s rival university, Kansas State. It was in those undergraduate years that they found Delta Zeta and formed a commitment to the sorority. Then they began following the yellow-brick road to legal careers, one a bit more tortuous than the other.


Becky, who was initiated in 1978, left Hays to earn her B.A. in German at K.U. She developed a strong interest in law while working part-time for a law firm as she was finishing her degree. So she earned another degree — this one an associate's degree in the paralegal program at Johnson County Community College (Kansas City).

After working as a legal secretary for several years, she decided to go to law school. "At that time, more and more women were entering the field and much of the encouragement for me came from the leadership I saw in Delta Zeta," says Becky. During law school, she spent summers clerking at law firms in Lawrence and Topeka.

Ten years after her initiation into Delta Zeta, she finally earned her J.D. and began her legal career. She has administered \$60 million of assets for personal, corporate and funeral trusts for UMB Bank, and maintained oil lease revenues for Koch Oil Co. of Wichita. She currently commutes to Kansas City where she is a lease administrator in the Retail Real Estate Department for Hallmark Cards, Inc. "It's nice to see other young women with professional careers," says Becky, who still finds inspiration in leadership roles of women.



have just returned from teaching English during the academic year of 1994-1995 at a teachers college in Hebei Province, Peoples' Republic of China. I went to learn of their language and culture, to teach, and to make new friends. I came home slightly frayed, 30 pounds lighter, but richer for this unique experience.

I was given no rules of conduct and so felt free to answer the students' ques-

tions on any subject. I also was allowed to travel alone by plane, bus, river boat and train. I met and talked with women of differing ages and professions, using my emergency Chinese and body language. I was invited into private homes for meals and also spent the night (after registering with the local police) in the home of student Wang Na Li.

Most Chinese have never seen an American and so I was an object of curiosity. I incidentally had 10 percent exposure to the 1.2 billion Chinese via television and

radio when giving a joint recital with tenor Rui Li.

My new friend Sung Hong Yong had retired from teaching at age 60 and was surprised that I am older than she and still very active. She had a devoted husband who did most of the cooking. Marriage was for a lifetime, but now divorce is creeping into more westernized cities such as Beijing. She said Mao's 1949 Revolution brought women freedom to

gone to Beijing and none of the girls aspired to attending the Women's Conference, though they wanted to go. I found the students (over 6,000) dressed very stylishly — heels, jackets, ties. They were also polite and got along well with

each other, though crowded eight to a dormitory room. Most students come from peasant parents and feel

> duty-bound to excel in their studies because of their parents' great sacrifice in sending them to college. Their energy goes into sports, studies and develop-

ing their talents.

I didn't see any sexual overtones on campus or on television. The Chinese are very conservative. Many girls felt they were too young to date, and took their mother's advice about marriage. Students cannot marry, then must wait until age 23. Homosexuality is taboo. Birth control appliances are only given to married women and sex education has only started in

Beijing. One boy said, "They haven't told us anything!" So when our text touched on health issues, I threw in a lecture on AIDS under general knowledge for future teachers.

"Psychology" was in the vocabulary list but the meaning was unknown, calling forth a lecture on Freud, Jung and the subconscious mind as related to mental and physical health. "Theology" and "American Holidays" drew forth another new field of information on world religions and the meanings of Good Friday, Easter and Christmas, using the Bible as a text. Religious freedom is now official (though no proselytizng) so I was allowed to receive these books and to donate them to the college library on departing.

Though my students have several brothers and sisters, they agree with the government policy of one family-one child. Parents of only one child are more prosperous and can raise the child on a higher living standard. These children are doted on (and spoiled too).

China is obviously overcrowded. I was squashed, squeezed and knocked down (needing surgery) just trying to cross a street after having looked both ways. Bicycles and trucks (sparse cars) jam the streets and sidewalks and stores are wall-to-wall people.

Many students want to come to the United States for study but have to pass a difficult language examination, have a sponsor to vouch for \$16,800 each year at Sonoma State University, AND get a visa. My student Wang Na Li passed the test, has a rich father, but fears she won't get the visa as she has been told, "You are too young — You won't return to China." (Seventy percent don't!)

So, will Wang Na Li get to attend SSU, and will the Beijing Conference For Women bring more equity and human rights to women? I certainly pray so, but meanwhile let's get to work on human rights for men, women and children in our own backyard. Only by stopping crime amongst ourselves can we point out the abuse in other countries.

Meet Colonel Michele Manning, USMC

Are you aware that there are only 10 women colonels in the United States Marine Corps? And, one of these is our own Michele Manning, Eastern Michigan University- $\Gamma\Sigma$ '65.

Mitzi Manning joined the Marine Corps in 1971 after teaching in Michigan and South Carolina for five years. On May 1 of this year she assumed command of Western Sector, United States Military Entrance Processing Command. She is stationed in Denver, Colorado.

Before assuming this post, Mitzi was assigned to the Marine Forces Pacific at Camp Smith, Hawaii, where she was Assistant Chief of Staff, G-1.

Her military career began in 1972 when she reported to the 30th Woman Officer Candidate Course at Quantico, Virginia. She is a graduate of the Marine Corps Command and Staff College and the College of Naval Warfare. Her awards and decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal with two gold stars and the Navy Commendation Medal.

The Western Sector which Mitzi commands spans a geographical area from the Mississippi River to Hawaii to Alaska. (Interesting also is the fact that the commander of the Eastern Section of the United States is Colonel Kathy Carlson, U.S. Army, a Zeta Tau Alpha from the University of South Carolina!)

The USMEPCOM is a Department of Defense joint-service command whose mission is to process individuals for enlistment into the Armed Forces. The Command, through its 68 Military Entrance Processing



Stations, determines an applicant's qualifications for enlistment based on standards set by each branch of military service.

Traditionally known as "induction stations" or Armed Forces Examining and Entrance Stations, today's modern MEPS bear little resemblance to fading memories of endless lines of inductees herded through drab, green-walled military buildings. Today's applicants receive dignified, personalized customer service in efficiently designed MEPS.

Our Colonel Mitzi Manning is a native of Washington and Wayne, Michigan. She graduated from Eastern Michigan University with a bachelor of science degree in physical education. She has also earned a master of education degree in guidance and counseling from Winthrop College and a master of arts degree in international and strategic studies from the Naval War College.



House Ear Institute Celebrates 50!

House Ear Institute is preparing for its biggest celebration yet — the 50th Anniversary. And, Delta Zetas nationwide are celebrating the sorority's 15-year affiliation with House Ear Institute — an internationally recognized hearing research and education center.

In Delta Zeta's 15-year association with the non-profit organization in Los Angeles, the Delta Zeta Foundation has contributed a total of \$310,760 in support of the research programs and clinical services in the Institute's Children's Auditory Research and Evaluation (CARE) Center. When the Institute moved to its new facility in 1990, the Delta Zeta Foundation designated a portion of the money for a Family Conference Room.

But the relationship between
Delta Zeta and House Ear Institute
has gone beyond financial. Janet Doak,
Institute Executive Vice President, was initiated into Delta Zeta, as were longtime institute supporters Nanette
Fabray and Florence Henderson.
June Stendahl House, wife of Dr.
William House, was a 1985 Conven-

tion initiate.

The friendship between the organizations has grown as Delta Zeta collegians frequently volunteer at the Institute's outreach programs where they have an opportunity to interact with the deaf and hard-of-hearing community; and the Institute benefits from the involvement of caring Delta Zetas. The famed California Flame Fantasy events, celebrity fashion shows coordinated by alumnae and collegians, net thousands of dollars annually for the Institute, as does the yearly Turtle Tug sponsored by Loyola-Marymount collegians. Last year's event raised \$1,000. And, it's not unusual to have House Ear Institute representatives on hand at the Delta Zeta events, says Dilys Jones, Associate Director of Public Relations,



who has attended several Flame Fantasy events, including A Day at the Races, as well as Loyola-Marymount's Turtle Tug.

A number of Delta Zeta chapters across the country have become sponsors of the Institute's Hearing is Priceless (HIP) hearing conservation program. HIP educates the hearing popu-

lation on the issues of noise pollution in the environment, the dangers of over exposure to loud sound, and hearing protection. A

segment of the program is a school package containing teaching materials and student activities that may be purchased and introduced into local high schools.

The relationship between House Ear Institute and Delta Zeta began when the Foundation became aware of the pioneering work done in the Institute's Children's Center. The cochlear implant, a device that provides a sensation of sound to profoundly deaf people, was about to be tested in children. As Delta Zeta learned more about the mission and achievements of the Institute, it was designated as one of the Delta Zeta Foundation's national philanthropies.

House Ear Institute continues to work for better understanding of causes, cures and prevention of otologic and neurologic

disorders, and to disseminate and apply the knowledge through professional education and training. Physicians and scientists at the Institute have developed surgical procedures to repair nerve problems and balance disorders; tested methods for early diagnosis of tumors growing on the auditory nerve; perfected infant and newborn hearing screening methods, and developed the workable, manufacturable cochlear implant. The Institute, long world famous for hearing research, garnered national attention when the Institute fitted Ronald Reagan with a hearing aid. Other celebrity patients included Bob Hope, Jimmy Stewart, Nancy Reagan and Buddy Ebsen.

Educational and networking programs sponsored by House Ear Institute include Family Camp, a three-day weekend retreat with educational workshops for hearing-impaired children and their parents; Safety Patrol, a program to educate hearing-impaired children on a variety of emergency issues; Summer Work Program, a full-time and part-time work program for hearing-impaired youth; and Teen Leadership Camps, a forum for teens to discuss issues they face growing up deaf or hard-of-hearing.

WHY WE GIVE ...

Something special happened at Delta Zeta's Omicron chapter at the University of Pittsburgh between 1923 and 1924. . . and we can't quite pinpoint what occurred.

Perhaps it was another visit from Maybelle Minton or when Omicron transformed from a "streetcar chapter" to an "apartment chapter." Whatever the spark, it kindled for nearly 75 years within the hearts of Helen Ruth Milar, 1923, and Vee Shakarian Toner, 1924.

Delta Zeta so touched their lives that each willed a considerable amount of her estate to the Delta Zeta Foundation. From these bequests, they are remembered as the first and second members of the Oxford Society, the Foundation's newest giving level.

Helen Milar, a life-long resident of the Pittsburgh-Carnegie area, remembered several individuals and charities in her will and "each meant something special." Helen, who taught Latin for many years in the Pittsburgh area schools, had a special affection for children, blind children in particular. Perhaps the Foundation's work with hearing-impaired children encouraged her gift.

Helen died at the age of 89 in March 1994. Little family was left, just a cousin aged 90. Highly educated, Helen held bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees from the University of Pittsburgh. After leaving teaching she enjoyed a second career as an executive secretary in the steel industry. Her avid interest in the stock market was more than a hobby—she followed the stock market daily—and made her own financial decisions. Once a prolific reader, when her eyesight began to dwindle she filled her apartment with radios — almost one in every room.

Why did Helen remember Delta Zeta so generously? Maybe it was the early years in Omicron, maybe the work with hearing-impaired children, maybe her Delta Zeta friends in the Pittsburgh area, maybe because most of her family preceded her in death.

Vee Toner, who also died in 1994, bequeathed a portion of her estate to the Vee Toner Loan Fund of the Delta Zeta Foundation. Vee, acclaimed for her participation in Olympic and AAU sports circles, had served the Foundation as vice-president, president protem, and national endowment chairman. Many will remember the national convention in Scottsdale when Vee, with her signature dark tan, dark glasses and "rose" hat, manned the Rose Shop, encouraging purchases of notepads, pens and pencils — all to benefit Delta Zeta scholarships. She was Delta Zeta's Woman of the Year in 1969, the first woman named to the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame and the first American woman to be named as a chair umpire at Wimbledon. Amidst her international travels, work with Pittsburgh altruistic groups, and sports obligations, she always found time for Delta Zeta and the Foundation. By careful estate planning, Vee's memory lives on to benefit Delta Zeta collegians.

To enroll in the Oxford Society, donors should send the Delta

Zeta Foundation at National Headquarters notice in writing that the Foundation has been named a beneficiary in an estate plan. Notification may be in letter form. Donors are encouraged, but not required, to disclose the exact or estimated size of the gift. New members of the Oxford Society will be listed each year in the Foundation's Annual Report, but the value of the gift will not be published.

In addition to providing generous support to the Foundation, estate gifts can benefit donors and heirs as well. Income, capital gains and estate taxes can be significantly reduced through careful estate planning.

She and Cliff have three grown children and three grandchildren. Now living in San Antonio, Elsie and Cliff divide their time between their new home and their ranch, where she loves feeding the cattle, watching the wildlife, and entertaining friends and family.

Only two months earlier, Winfield McChord had written Joan Lowry to thank the Foundation for its \$100 gift to the Early Childhood Program at the school.



STATEMENT OF ACTIVITY AND FUND PRINCIPAL


FOR THE YEARS ENDED JUNE 30, 1995 AND 1994



Grants & Scholarships Year ending June 30, 1995




Foundation Income Year ending June 30, 1995


